# September, 2019: 25th Anniversary Report

As you know from the August newsletter we attended the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration of the Museum which occurred August 28<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup>. We arrived early and stayed for a week and enjoyed it all! Roughly 8,000 others from across Canada, the US (including Hawaii) and a handful from Europe attended too. They drove laps on the MSP track, purchased all sorts of merchandise, attended a rock concert with fireworks, street parties or the Hall of Fame Induction Banquet and caught up with friends or made new ones! Caravans arrived on Wednesday and Thursday making for a very busy Museum! It must have been those two plus years of planning that allowed things to run as smoothly as they did! Hundreds of red-shirted volunteers were everywhere – helping out by doing all sorts of tasks.

When we arrived at the NCM on Monday, our first stop was to view our COD club bricks and they look great! Kudos again to Jan Raven for spearheading the fundraising last year for additional bricks to honour COD members and friends who have passed on. Placed alongside, are bricks purchased by some of our members recently in support of the Museum. There are a few photos on the next page and more on the COD website.

We attended Friday's seminar given by the Assembly Plant Manager, Kai Spande. When asked about the restart of **Plant Tours**, Kai said "**the best time would be for the 2020 Bash**". That news was met with loud hoorays and applause but has yet to be confirmed. We can expect the dates to be announced by the NCM at some point in a weekly e-news update, so stay tuned! Kai talked about other interesting things (for example, the last 2019 Stingray Coupe and last ZR1 off the line are going to the Museum; the C8 steering wheel shape is perfectly integrated into the dash; the Plant produces 11.6 cars/hour) but most of Kai's comments soon appeared online and can be read on CorvetteBlogger.com, along with photos since the author was there in the audience too.

Also on Friday, we were honoured with a certificate and lapel pin marking our 15 years' if NCM membership. In the same group were Bob & Cathy Harder, members of CCO.

At the Ambassadors' breakfast meeting, we were introduced to and heard remarks from the Museum's newly appointed President & CEO, Dr. Sean Preston. He spoke of the NCM's mandate to preserve and maintain those vehicles and artifacts donated to the Museum. Most artifacts will soon be housed in a nearby building, recently acquired from the FOP (Fraternal Order of Police). Sean also spoke of further expansion of the Museum and the MSP (track) with 'town hall' meetings with neighbouring residents to be planned soon. We learned that the current Executive Director, Wendell Strode, will officially retire January 3 next year after 22 years' invaluable service to the National Corvette Museum.

GM provided several C8s for not only viewing, but for 'trying out' the seats, checking the front and rear storage compartments and of course, photo ops! Soft-side C8 luggage, built to fit this car, was on hand and guess what...it really does fit! Those C8s were in addition to the C8s driven from Detroit by GM personnel who attended and spoke at seminars – Harlan Charles, Tadge Juechter, Kirk Bennion and others. It was almost a nightly car show in their hotel parking lot enjoyed by the California and Ontario Caravans also residing in the same hotel! GM also

provided an engine cutaway; paint, seatbelt, wheel, tire and seat samples located in a temporary building erected overnight before most participants arrived. (Those who attended Carlisle the week prior saw this also.)

Numerous vendor booths were set up outside (ACS, Corsa, Adams, NCRS, Michelin, Ron Fellows Performance Driving School, a variety of food & beverage) and inside also (Adams again, C-Magic, Dana Forester-Corvette paintings, jewelry, windscreens and C8 luggage). Daily long line-ups for the Corvette Café were normal! A children's play area was set up outside for the little ones; and rides were available in the 1968 Astrovette!

To round out the week, we drove laps on the Motorsports Park track (*Ron says he wore out the tires*!!), attended a Michelin Tire seminar, a C8 Overview, the HOF Induction Banquet, Jefferson Starship concert in the Museum's outdoor Amphitheatre with friends, toured the Museum displays including the 1994 retrospective, enjoyed dinner out with other friends, visited/chatted with many others – including fellow COD members Margaret & Richard Chute and others we know from Corvette Racing/CTMP. In addition, between us, we volunteered 46 hours in the Museum store and warehouse. The weather was, overall, warm and sunny with cool mornings and hot afternoons. It rained as we approached Bowling Green and overnight the first night there, and again on our return home.

Bottom line – we had a great time and were pleased to be a part of the Museum's history, as others had before us!





This month's Corvette Racing report comes from COD member Norby Dippold, who attended the August 2-4 race at the Road America track in Wisconsin.

#### What we saw at Road America – Besides the IMSA Race

Many of you know that Patty and I attend the IMSA race at Road America each year. Road America (Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin) is my favourite track as it is one of the few tracks where all the internal roads are paved, they have real washrooms with showers almost everywhere and the grass is as green and as well-kept as your own and has REAL food not just burgers, sausages and fries. It is the longest track on the IMSA circuit at 4.4 miles (7.08KMS), which allows the cars to really stretch their legs. The Corvette parade lap is usually two laps or almost 9 miles and you can get up to a decent speed. The main reason Patty and I attended, of course, is to see our beloved Corvette C7R go up against the best of Porsche, Ford and BMW.

This year is the last year for the C7R which will be replaced by the new C8R (not official yet). I think that 2020 is going to be a great year for Corvette Racing.

So, what did we see at Road America? Well, Chevrolet brought to the track a Zeus Bronze Metallic C8 with Natural Dipped interior and a Rapid Blue C8 with Jet Black interior with orange seat belts.

The Bronze one was at the GM display and because Patty and I were there very early (10:00 am) on Thursday, the car was uncovered and sitting with very little protection around it. The majority of the crowds don't show up on Thursday as it is really set-up day. By about 11 AM you couldn't get close to the car with people

packed around it about 10 deep; and on Saturday and Sunday you would think that the Corvette was the only thing GM produced!

The Rapid Blue Vette turned up on Sunday morning behind the Corral so as to been seen only by the Corvette owners and quests in the Corral. There was a rumor that there was another one circulating the area of Elkhart Lake but no one could track it down. We found out later it was hiding in a plain white car trailer about 50 feet from the Corral! I tell you the car did not sneak in the Corral as the sound alone brought many people out of the tent to see what all the noise was about. YES, it sounds like a Corvette!!! Ed Piatek, Chief Corvette Engineer and Phil Minch, Corvette Program Engineering Manager gave us a 30-minute circle presentation on the car. It was more technical than the Reveal program.

The foot wells are deep; even a 6'6" person could easily relax in the cockpit. The frunk (front) can hold what they say is a normal size carry-on bag and the trunk (rear) can hold two normal (small) golf bags. Storage may be a little tight for those of us that do multi-day road tours.

The pictures we saw from the Reveal or in various press magazines do not do this car justice. Somehow the pictures distort the size and dimensions. Seeing it live almost makes you want to sell the one you have now and order one. I have really been taken aback after seeing it. It looks a lot like a number of mid-engine cars (Ferrari 458, Acura NSX etc.) but it is still a Corvette.

Prices start at under \$60K US and under \$70 CDN (base car); as of this writing there are no pricing for options.

Oh, I forgot, our team did not do well at Road America. With a late pit stop (3 laps to go) we finished 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>. Ask me about other places we stopped at when you see Patty or me at the next COD event.
