There will be celebrations all around the area so check your borough or library for your neighborhood festivities and fireworks schedule.

MUSINGS...PROCEED AS WAY OPENS

"Proceed as Way opens" is a gentle and profound piece of Quaker wisdom. It suggests a posture of patience, receptivity, and trust—a way of moving through life that listens for clarity instead of forcing it. Rather than racing ahead with plans or grasping for certainty, this phrase invites us to pause, watch, and move forward only when the path becomes clear.

Quakers are known for their practice of spiritual discernment. They gather in silence, listening for the promptings of the "Inner Light." Instead of pushing ahead with ambition or external goals, they often wait for a "leading," and speak of "Way opening" as a sign that the time is right to act. This approach reflects a belief that true guidance comes not from ego or pressure but from a quiet voice within.

Before I ever heard this phrase, I experienced it.

The George Story

I had a new coaching client and went to my closet to get a fresh binder for our work. There were none, so I headed to the basement where I kept old binders from past engagements. I pulled one at random—it was from a university where I'd coached a facilities management team. A team member had hired me, but the leader had also engaged thoughtfully, offering suggestions that deepened the work. Curious, I emailed him at his old address. Surprisingly, he replied.

He had left the university, written several books, and was now living a nomadic, environmentally conscious life. He sent me his books—I liked them. He disliked hierarchy and had implemented a "Council of Equals" leadership model. I sent him my book Fresh Views and casually said, "If you're ever near Pittsburgh, stop by."

He replied, saying he didn't travel unless he could stay several months. I surprised myself and invited him to come stay for several months. Some of my friends were aghast. But I was listening inwardly, step by step. We had phone and Zoom conversations. There was no romance; we were cautious and clear. He agreed to come in the winter and rent my library. Either of us could back out at any time. Still, I kept listening. Proceed as Way opens.

That was several years ago. George now returns for a few months every year. We're kindred spirits, compatible and independent. We support each other's creativity and laugh a lot. He's thoughtful, handy, and cooks. My friends now ask, "Where can I find a George?" My answer: Proceed as Way opens.

By the way, I learned the phrase from George.

Quaker author Parker J. Palmer writes, "The way will open—not necessarily in the direction you thought it would."

By letting go of trying to control the outcome, something wiser and more organic may unfold.

A Mindset Shift

This mindset—shifting from striving to receptivity—can be profoundly liberating. It doesn't mean passivity or inaction, but rather a readiness to act when the moment is right, guided by inner clarity rather than outer urgency. It invites us to trust life's unfolding and embrace humility, knowing we don't have to figure everything out in advance.

The wisdom of "proceed as way opens" reminds us that life is rarely a straight road. It's more like a forest path—revealed one step at a time. And when we release control and walk with openness and trust, the way not only opens—it often leads to something richer, deeper, and more surprising than we could have planned.

COACHING QUESTION:

Where, in your life, would it be helpful to "Proceed as Way opens?"

The Fishin' Hole

The year seems to be flying by so fast. I find that as I get older the time goes by faster and faster with each passing year. That is certainly one of those things that you hear when you are younger and you just kind of nod and think to yourself, "why are old people so weird?" But it is very true and it is also impossible to get younger people to understand. What that means for fishing I am not certain, it just occurred to me as I was sitting down to write this that it is already about to be July of 2025. That is how that first sentence came into exist-

There are a couple of great events in July for anglers in our area. First, on July 4th, Pennsylvania will have our second "Fish for Free" day of 2025. Fish-for-Free Days allow anyone (resident or non-resident) to legally fish on Pennsylvania waterways on the designated days with NO FISHING LICENSE REQUIRED (Trout/Salmon and Lake Erie permits are also NOT required). All other fishing regulations still apply. It is a perfect day to try fishing and see if it is something you want to get more

involved with. It is also a perfect day to introduce a friend to fishing. Once you have a fishing friend, you have a friend for life!

Secondly, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission is having a fishing meet up event Friday, July 18th at Burrell Park in New Kensington.

Fishing meet-up events are social gatherings for anyone interested in learning more about the basics of fishing. This informal event is the perfect opportunity to socialize, learn, and share fishing experiences with other anglers. Equipment and bait is provided; participants may also bring their own tackle. Those under age eighteen must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Here is an excerpt from the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission's web page about the event.

About the Event

Are you curious about catfish? Join Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) education staff in a fishing meet-up to target catfish! Lower Burrell Park Pond (also known as Holtzhauer Lake) is a great place to catch catfish! PFBC has a long history of stocking the lake with Channel Catfish, which means you'll have an excellent chance of catching one! PFBC provides equipment, bait, and tackle for participant use. Participants may also bring their own fishing rods and tackle. Fishing license requirement is waived during the program.

The event runs from 7 until 9 p.m. at Burrell Lake Park located at 201 Delberta Road in New Kensington. Yes, it is basically another fish for free day with bait and tackle provided plus

the added bonus of a stocked Channel Catfish lake to fish. Channel Catfish are very aggressive and plentiful and they get very big as well. They are loads of fun to catch and I often target them on out local streams where they are not stocked. A stocking program means you're nearly guaranteed to have a grand time at this event and catch some big fish as well. You can register at www.pafishandboat.com.

Summertime fishing is in full swing on our local waterways, but I have just returned from a week of surf fishing in the Atlantic Ocean. I feel the same way about fishing in the ocean as I do about fishing in our rivers around here, the constant possibility of anything happening and any kind of fish getting involved keeps me coming back time after time. It wasn't the best week of fishing but I definitely had a couple of fun days, including a Flounder that gobbled up my "Gotcha Plug" the second time I tossed it into the ocean. That Flounder and a dozen or so Atlantic Croaker scratched my fishing itch in just the right spot. The "possibility factor" kept me fishing all week long. In fact the "possibility factor" has kept me fishing for over forty-five years, now that I think of it. I hope it does the same for you. Time really does start to fly by as you get older, keep those lines tight and send your pictures and stories to samdhall@comcast.net.






