# MG ROBERT A. MCCLURE MEDALLION - GOLD

*The Special Operations Center of Excellence*



- Purpose: Recognize individuals who made a significant and lasting contribution and have significantly contributed to the welfare and advancement of the Psychological Operations Regiment
- Gold Medallion is the highest and most prestigious order of the McClure Medallion. It is presented to the most distinguished member(s) of the Psychological Operations Regiment who have contributed to the career field and function of PO in support of national defense and should be recognized as a lifetime achievement award.
- Nominee **must be a qualified member of the Regiment** (or predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
- Recommended base criteria:
  - May be Active Army, Army Reserve, or National Guard officer, warrant officer, or enlisted member, Civilian.
  - Successfully completed / graduated the qualification course / requirements of the time.
  - Recommended minimum of fifteen (15) years or more of service in various units and organizations
  - Civilian contributions that directly support the PO Regiment.
  - Demonstrate the highest standards of integrity, moral character, outstanding degree of professional competence, an unblemished career, and **contributions to the Regiment must be considered above and beyond that of their peers for the professionalism, promotion and advancement of the PO Regiment and greater PO / MISO Community.**
  - Lifetime of service to the Regiment that epitomizes the standards of performance and excellence that has earned them unquestionable respect and admiration of the PO / MISO Community.

# MG ROBERT A. MCCLURE MEDALLION - SILVER

- Purpose: Recognize individuals who made a significant and lasting contribution and have significantly contributed to the welfare and advancement of the Psychological Operations Regiment
- Silver Medallion is the second highest order of the McClure Medallion. It is presented to the individuals who have had an exceptionally significant impact on the Psychological Operations Regiment.
- Nominee **must be a qualified member of the Regiment** (or predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
- Service performed must have had a singularly outstanding positive impact on each organization or activity, where the individual was assigned, demonstrated by exceptional performance of duty in various positions with progressive increased in responsibility.
- Recommended base criteria:
  - May be Active Army, Army Reserve, or National Guard officer, warrant officer, or enlisted member, Civilian.
  - Successfully completed / graduated the qualification course / requirements of the time.
  - Recommended minimum of ten (10) years or more of service in various units and organizations.
  - Demonstrate the highest standards of integrity, moral character, outstanding degree of professional competence, an unblemished career, and **contributions to the Regiment must be considered above and beyond that of their peers for the professionalism, promotion and advancement of the PO Regiment and greater PO / MISO Community.**
  - Successfully served as a battalion / group Commander or equivalent.
  - Successfully served as a battalion / group Command Sergeant Major or equivalent.
- Additional criteria: Individuals who do not meet the above recommended criteria may also be considered.
  - Individuals awarded a Silver Star or higher award for valor while serving within PO / MISO organizations.

# MG ROBERT A. MCCLURE MEDALLION - BRONZE

- Purpose: Recognize individuals who made a significant and lasting contribution and have significantly contributed to the welfare and advancement of the Psychological Operations Regiment
- Bronze Medallion is the third highest order of the McClure Medallion. It is presented to the individuals who have demonstrated a high degree of professional competence, standards of integrity and moral character and a strong devotion to duty to the Regiment.
- Nominee **must be a qualified member of the Regiment** (or predecessor unit / organization prior to the establishment of the Regiment).
- Service performed must have has a singularly outstanding positive impact on each organization or activity, where the individual was assigned, demonstrated by exceptional performance of duty in various positions with progressive increased in responsibility.
- Recommended base criteria:
  - May be Active Army, Army Reserve, or National Guard officer, warrant officer, or enlisted member, Civilian.
  - Successfully completed / graduated the qualification course / requirements of the time
  - Recommended minimum of five (5) years or more of service in various units and organizations
  - Demonstrate the highest standards of integrity, moral character, high degree of professional competence, an unblemished career, and **contributions to the Regiment must be considered above and beyond that of their peers for the professionalism, promotion and advancement of the PO Regiment and greater PO / MISO Community.**
  - Clearly stand out in the eyes of their seniors, peers, and subordinates.
  - Demonstrated successful tactical and technical competence and leadership in tactical, regional, dissemination or specialty PO unit / organization as a minimum of a PO Team Sergeant or PO Detachment Commander or equivalent.
- Additional criteria: Individuals who do not meet the above recommended criteria may be considered.
  - Individuals received valorous award while serving within PO / MISO organizations.
