One of my favorite passages in Scripture is Jeremiah 29. It was written by the prophet Jeremiah in a letter to the exiles, who are finding themselves far from home. The people have come to Babylon, under imperial rule, and they're traumatized by everything they've lost. In this moment of uprootedness, they're searching for meaning, for something to hold onto, which is something I think we can all relate to in times of struggle.

In this letter, Jeremiah tells the people that they will be in Babylon for at least 70 years, a whole lifetime for them. He tells the people that they should settle down, build houses, marry and even pray for peace and prosperity in the city in which they now find themselves.

For me, this passage serves as a reminder that we don't know what God's plan is, or where God is taking us, but that we should seek to be a people of peace in our relationships, at work or school or home, and especially in our communities. It's a reminder that we should bless and serve our communities. This passage also keeps me grounded in the communities where I find myself, and reminds me just how wonderful they are.

As we begin to approach September, I can't believe that our kids are already gearing up for school again, and we're preparing for the fall season and shorter days. The summer zoomed by!

I & S

The I & S committee met for its monthly meeting and looked over the financial health of the church. Once again our expenses were higher than our revenue. This is not due to excessive spending by our committees. All our committees are under budget as of this date. Each month in 2023, year to date, we have not met our expenses. Thankfully, we had a reserve coming into 2023.

Our goal is to always be transparent to you. We started 2023 with a nice healthy balance of \$74,034.79. This looks good on paper, but this balance was the result of having a half-time pastor for a year and a half and very little programming all during the pandemic. Our full-time pastor began in July 2022. We have also been catching up with repairs to the manse and church. As you can see from the figures below, receipts have not kept up with our expenditures this year. **The 2023 budget is \$140,193. The average weekly amount needed to support our budget is \$3,000.**

It is not too late to pay you Per Capita of \$32.50 if you are able. This definitely helps our budget.

ours for peace and reconciliation work, and 25% goes to mid councils for similar ministries on the regional level.
