WHEREAS, The City of Desloge is applying for federal assistance from the Recreational Trails Program for the purpose of Phase One of the Desloge City Park Fitness Trail.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF DESLOGE, MISSOURI, THAT

SECTION ONE: City Administrator Dan Bryan of the City of Desloge is authorized to sign the application for federal assistance and any other official project documentation that are required by the State of Missouri and /or the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION TWO: The City of Desloge currently has the written commitment for the minimum 20% matching share for the project elements that are identified in the application and will allocate the necessary funds to complete the project.

SECTION THREE: The City of Desloge will commit the necessary financial resources to operate and maintain the completed project in a safe and attractive manner for public access for minimum of 25 years.

SECTION FOUR: The City of Desloge is prepared to complete the project within the time period identified on the signed project agreement.

SECTION FIVE: The City of Desloge will comply with all rules and regulations of the Recreational Trails Program and all state laws that govern the grant applicant during the performance of the project.
