In Acts 2:42 (They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to fellowship to the breaking of bread and to prayer) we read that one of the four things the early church devoted itself to was "fellowship". Fellowship was a very important part of their reason for meeting together. It was one of their objectives. But what is fellowship?

We often hear people talking about fellowship. It has been said that we need more fellowship. Our modern day ideas of fellowship have become so watered down that the word no longer carries the same meaning it did in New Testament times.

Luke tells us these early Christians devoted themselves to fellowship. This means that fellowship was a priority and one of the objectives for gathering together. They made fellowship a priority.

Recently our Club President mentioned that they were two groups of people he liked to spend time with - his church friends and his car club friends. As he made this statement I couldn't help but agree with him. As I thought about this and was reminded about the fellowship we felt when we joined the club.

We often view fellowship as what we do in "fellowship hall". It is the place where we have casual conservations and some coffee and donuts. 


