program. We had another person match the congregational giving and it was designated for the General Fund. Thank you to all who helped us raise these funds.

<u>We were privileged to learn more about Mental Health</u> from a representative from the National Alliance on Mental Illness on Saturday morning, Feb. 24. There were 10 persons in attendance. We learned about how the brain works, human Interactions, Escalation, and overall Safety. "<u>As long as we call it 'Mental Illness' people will think it is about 'thinking.'</u> <u>WE MUST call it what it is – it is Brain-Illness.</u> She encouraged us to have a plan for safety. This morning was well worth attending.

Souper Bowl of Caring Offering was held on February 9

Our "Little Ones" were at the sanctuary doors collecting for this offering. They collected \$288.55 in their pots. This offering is the single largest way that Presbyterians join together to share God's love with our neighbors-in-need around the world. The three programs it supports are:

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - goes to communities after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters. **Presbyterian Hunger Program** - takes action to alleviate hunger. **Self-Development of People** - invests in communities to teach people to help themselves.
