The National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW) is a grassroots organization of volunteers and advocates who turn progressive ideals into action. It is understood as healing and transforming the world. *Tikkun*, the word for repair, is not just the responsibility of a community though; it is something for individuals as well. I do not know of anything more hopeful than the message of *Tikkun Olum* – that through our work and through our actions, we can strive to make our world and the world of others a better place.

## **FROM THE DESK OF THE STATE POLICY ADVOCATE (S.P.A.) CHAIR**

### **Step # 1: Awareness**

### **Step # 2: DO SOMETHING!!**

On October 22<sup>nd</sup>, our Section took the lead in publicizing a very disturbing new documentary. We invited our friends and coalition partners to join a community viewing of *Birthright: A War Story*, a film that depicted the status of women's rights in the U.S. today.

In January 1973, with the Supreme Court's landmark decision on *Roe v. Wade*, women gained the right to have autonomy over our bodies and our right to plan our family dynamics. And since that day, new laws chipping away at those rights have been passed by Congress and state legislatures. The opposition to *Roe v. Wade*, which established reproductive justice for all, is ideologically driven and religiously inspired. Personally, I don't understand why the right-to-life movement -- or "pro-birthers" as I call them -- allow for abortion under certain circumstances, such as rape or incest. If they truly believe pregnancy is divinely inspired and the "unborn" must be protected, why is it acceptable for some to be aborted? What difference does it make why it became "unborn"? Please put this question to a pro-birth individual and send me their answer.

So, what can we do? We must get to work on the 2018 elections. If we want to change the status quo and stop the continuing loss of our rights, we must elect different lawmakers. We can attend voter registration seminars and get more voters to the polls across the state. We can join voter registration drives, make personal phone calls to friends and relatives and emphasize the importance of voting in this country.

Many people are not familiar with "P.E.V.L." – the Permanent Early Voting List -- the process of voting by mail. A form on the Arizona Secretary of State website, <https://www.azsos.gov/elections/voting-election/register-vote-or-update-your-current-voter-information> can be downloaded and filled out and mailed to a County Recorder office in the county in which you reside. The addresses and/or hours of operation are posted at on the following website: <https://www.azsos.gov/elections/voting-election/contact-information-county-election-officials>. Upon processing, notices will be sent informing the voter that they are on the P.E.V.L. and a ballot will be mailed for each general and special election going forward.

Ask everyone you know if they are on this list and if the answer is no, give them these instructions. You can cut and paste the above paragraph and share the information. **And this goes to Step # 2: DOING SOMETHING!!**




