

Social media exposure requires an ongoing effort that allows promotion of our monthly luncheons and our broader Moore County Republican values.
Occasionally, social media also provides an outlet to demonstrate the futility and deceit of the radical Left.

Instagram images are especially powerful, and require very little investment in time to prepare, and even less time to be consumed by recipients. (Note: If you are not inclined to post images to Instagram, that's OK. But we encourage everyone to establish a free Instagram account in order to follow "mcncgop" and other Conservative Instagramers such as "repmarkmeadows", "vgagolf", "loneconservative", and, last but not least, "realdonaldtrump").

Our "mcncgop" Instagram account has attracted 124 followers over the past five months. Lora Sherwin

maintains the account and posts often. To date, we have 80 total posts, and we are just getting started.

On Facebook, while taking a break for the Christmas season, we are building an audience by "boosting" our posts -- essentially paying a small fee to target our audiences and reach likeminded citizens in our geographic region. We invest about \$100 per month on this front. During the past 60 days, we invested \$200 on Facebook "boosts". Our posts reached 8,396 people, triggered engagement by 1,090 and link clicks by 390. These link clicks are very important, as they drive Facebook users to our Men's Club web site to reserve luncheon tickets or to our issues blog, RESOLVE, to read commentary from a Conservative perspective.

As one example, on December 12 we posted a link to a RESOLVE post reviewing the colossal mess involving fraud allegations in the state's 9th Congressional district, which denied Republican Mark Harris from being seated when the 116th U.S. Congress convened January 3. The link attracted 15 comments (some negative), 46 engagements, and in the first 24 hours reached 1,158 people. By "boosting" the post for \$20 and targeting the audience, we reached 108 people "organically" (people already following us), but a staggering 1,050 people who otherwise might not have encountered the post.

If you have any questions or comments about our social media efforts, just let me know. I look forward to seeing you at the January meeting.

Peggy Noonan, in a year-end column for *The Wall Street Journal*, asks "Trump insiders" to speak candidly about how the administration conducts the

people's business. Two years are indeed enough time to evaluate the conduct of our government—including the duplicity in Congress and the vigilante style of the Justice Department and the IRS. Yet Ms. Noonan focuses her ire on President Donald Trump while overlooking these and other malefactors.

When the press stretches facts about events on Capitol Hill and in the bureaucracy, when the Justice Department decides to obfuscate facts and ignore subpoenas, when we learn that Congress has a secret slush fund to silence sexual-harassment accusers, these scandals often are made public by Trump insiders willing to speak honestly about what Americans have long suspected.

When Defense Secretary Jim Mattis resigned his post, we heard his message. The former general is in the fight to win, as is expected of a fine career officer. Yet others in the administration argue candidly



that it is futile to fight a war for 18 years without rules of engagement sufficient to defeat our enemy. Experience tells us that peace does not come through empty promises and plane loads of cash.

Ms. Noonan suggests that honest Trump insiders are cowed by the president's operatives, becoming "figures of "obloquy." He has persevered to the point of friction and beyond, and that is where true leaders go.

And it was a Democrat who spilled the beans on their hypocrisy.

The government shutdown over the border wall funding battle has seen a number of excuses from Democrats. One, however, has been cost for the wall. When Kentucky's Democratic Rep. John Yarmuth appeared on The Hill's "Rising" on Friday, he admitted the amount requested is chump change compared to other amounts the Democrats have been willing to pay for border security.

Oopsie! Since he seemed to fumble his way through the interview, can we trust what he said about that? Yes, we can!

The Daily Wire reported that there has been more than one time in the past when the Democrats approved higher amounts of funding for border security.

In 2006 that amount was \$50 billion over a period of 25 years. It was approved by 26 Senate Democrats.

The Boston Globe reported that the funds were to cover a secure barrier along the southern border. Then-Sens. Hillary Clinton, Joe Biden, and Barack Obama all voted for the Secure Fence Act of 2006.

The Globe goes on to note that Obama praised the bill at the time, saying, "The bill before us will certainly do some good."

He also spoke of how it would create "better fences and better security along our borders."

The then-future president also praised the fact that it would "help stem some of the tide of illegal immigration in this country." But that is not the only example of Democratic hypocrisy on border wall spending.

In 2013, all 54 Senate Democrats voted to approve \$46 billion for border security. That funding included spending for 700 miles of fencing, wrote The Daily Wire.

An <u>Associated Press</u> report explained that the 700 miles of fencing included an additional 350 miles of new fencing. The funding was given in part to "ensure that 90 percent of would-be crossers are caught or turned back."

That was then. Now, those same Democrats who were for border security are against it, because they don't like President Donald Trump.

Meanwhile, the elected heads of border states who know the issue best, like Texas Gov. Greg Abbott and Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey, know how important border security is.

Governor Perry was right. That's why Texas will continue to fund border security that adds law enforcement, National Guard, boats, planes, detection and deterrence devices and more. Ducey told <u>KTAR News</u> in January 2017, before Trump was even sworn into office, that he supported a border wall provided the state's business relationship with Mexico is not harmed.

Let me start the year with a definition from the online Merriam-Webster dictionary:

dubious adjective

du·bi·ous | \ dü-bēes also dyü- \ Definition of dubious 1: unsettled in opinion : DOUBTFULL

was dubious about the plan.

2: giving rise to <u>uncertainty</u>: such as a: of doubtful promise or outcome a *dubious* plan

b: questionable or <u>suspect</u> as to true nature or quality the practice is of *dubious* legality

So why a definition of the word "dubious?" Well, as you might guess, there is a story that goes with this opening. On Tuesday evening, January 8 at 9:00pm EST, President Trump gave his first Oval Office address of his presidency. It was covered by all major network and cable television stations. The President's address lasted just under 9 minutes and was followed by a response by Democrats, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer.

President Trump has appealed for \$5.7M in funding for construction of additional barriers on our southern border. If funding is granted, it could result in additional appropriations to end the closing of about 25% of the federal government. Pelosi and Schumer supported ending the federal government shutdown, but oppose any further border "wall" construction, saying it would be a waste of money.

Nothing really new on this issue from either side, just more rhetoric on both sides to support their already well know positions. It is worth noting, however, that the much ballyhooed Presidential declaration of a national emergency did NOT happen.

Having set the stage with the above review of events, I would continue my story (some will say "rant") with some observations about the after broadcast comments I saw. In our household, my wife's choice of national news is NBC, she is a Lester Holt fan. We were tuned to NBC, so that is where we watched the President and the Dem rebuttal. After these concluded, there was commentary lead by Lester which included most of the NBC "news" reporters.

So started the condemnation of everything Trump and wall and the affirmation of everything Pelosi-Schumer. While this anti-Trump, pro-Dems approach was not unexpected, the use of the word "dubious" in the follow-up comments was painfully apparent. It seemed that each reporter, starting with Holt and going through each of the usual reporters used the word "dubious" describing every point made by the President. Put another way, it seemed as if and maybe was intended to be a code way of saying that President Trump lied about and misrepresented every point he made!

Also, because every one of the reporters used the same code word, it seemed like it had to be preplanned and rehearsed. Bells of Balangiga Returned: Three bells, taken as war trophies in the Philippines 117 years ago, were returned to the village of Balangiga on December 11. U.S. soldiers took the three bells following a fierce battle in the village, where the bells were used to signal an ambush that killed 48 U.S. service members. Since 1904, 2 of the bells have been at a Wyoming air base. The third was found at the 2nd Infantry Division museum at Camp Red Cloud, South Korea. The return of the bells was achieved through the efforts of Congress, the VFW, and the Philippine government.

MIA Update: This week, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced 13 new identifications. Nine were sailors on the USS Oklahoma, sunk Dec. 7, 1941, at Pearl Harbor. One was killed in Germany, in Nov. 1944, and one crashed in China, in July 1945. A soldier killed in

Mere Hours After 'Reporter' Jim Acosta Labels The Border A Utopia, 20 Charred Dead Bodies Are Found

As <u>reported</u> by CNN, Mexican officials found at least 20 dead bodies — most of them burned — along the border, about 50 miles west of McAllen, Texas on Wednesday. Accompanying them were four charred trucks and a sedan along a dirt road in the border state of Tamaulipas.

Something crazy happened:

The incident appeared to be the result of a confrontation between two criminal gangs, Tamaulipas Attorney General Irving Barrios Mojica told journalist Carmen Aristegui in an interview for her radio show in Mexico. Aristegui is also the host of a show on CNN en Español.

He said some of the victims had been wearing "tactical vests with military-type uniforms" and bullets were found nearby that came from weapons typically only used by the military.

Barrios Mojica indicated the area where the bodies were found is being fought over by criminal gangs looking to traffic drugs, weapons and people. Yet, the discovery was announced by the left-wing network just hours after its <u>anti-reporter</u>, Jim

Acosta, hailed wonderful notions of staggering border tranquility.
