What is Title I?

Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support



family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how DuBois Integrity Academy will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. DuBois Integrity Academy will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, and with disabilities.

2021-22 School Goals

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learning or above on the Georgia Milestone Lang. Arts will increase by five percent.
- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learning or above on the Georgia Milestone math will increase by five percent.
- The percent of DIA K-6th grade students scoring proficient in Math and Reading on MAP will increase annually10 points from Fall to Spring.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, DuBois and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Community Cares event and the School Forum. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

Opportunities for Meaningful Parent Consultation
