



Even before Jesus came to this earth, ashes were important for people in their relationship with God. We see that ashes are used throughout the Old Testament to symbolize, initiate, and help people enter into a true repentance of heart (e.g. Eccl. 3:20, Jonah 3:5-6, Job 42:6, Daniel 9:3, Esther 4:1). Jesus also mentions ashes with repentance in Matthew 11:21. This repentance is not simply being sorry for our sins, but it is a turning around for the purpose of beginning a whole new life with Christ! Ashes clearly symbolize our mortality, our brokenness, our weakness, and our utter dependence upon God's grace for all the good that we do in our lives. As we begin the 40 days of the Lenten season this Ash Wednesday, let us ask God honestly what type of goals he desires us to set for at least the big three: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (charitable giving). God wants this time to be a period of both serious effort on our part, but above all a realization that Christ is truly present with us and wants to heal us, transform us, and raise us up to a new life with Him this Easter. It begins with utter dependence on Christ for all that is God, and asking Him to help us encounter and receive His love for us even more fully this Ash Wednesday and this Lenten season as well.





Discussing the Readings with your children.



Our Gospel today is a series of very short parables, short stories that teach a lesson.

Jesus asks his disciples,
"How can you say to
your brother, 'Brother,
let me remove the splinter in your eye', when
you do not even notice
the wooden beam from
your eye first?"


Jesus teaches that we need to look honestly at ourselves first, If we notice our own faults, mistakes, and weaknesses first, then we can be a better neighbor. We might be able to help someone with their shortcomings, or we might be more understanding because we recognize that we are not perfect either.

Later in the Gospel, Jesus says, "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruits."

We can tell whether people are good or bad by their words and by their actions. Jesus goes on to explain the parable. A good person has a good heart and does good things, just like a good tree bears good fruit.

We all want to bear good fruit. When we focus on ourselves, our words, and our actions first, we begin to bring the best out of ourselves. Only then can we help others to be their best as well.

Living our Faith: Be a tree that bears good fruit by doing something nice or kind for someone else each day this week.
