Photos of Eastsound May 12 - September 30, 2018

Our 2018 featured exhibit showcases 75 historical Eastsound images from the Museum's archives.

Photos of Eastsound marks over 120 years of change in the life and spirit of Eastsound. The exhibit traces the dramatic evolution from an expanse of orchards in the 1890's to the commercial center of Orcas that it is today. Visitors will have a chance to see the people, culture, and places that have made Eastsound a vibrant community to live, work, and to visit.



Visitors will also have a chance to vote for their favorite photograph and the winning photo will be honored at the conclusion of the exhibit. **Photos of Eastsound** is a chance for the Museum to survey and expand its collection of photos. By presenting our collection to the community, we hope to identify gaps and build a fuller and more cohesive representation of Eastsound for generations to come.
