Bouchard Aîné & Fils wines

BURGUNDY’S arrival into the De Vries Premium Wines portfolio marks a natural evolution in how Kenyan consumers are discovering wine. “Kenya’s premium wine market is maturing,” Beverly explains. “People are increasingly curious about origin, authenticity, and the story behind the bottle. Burgundy, with its iconic houses and deep heritage, fits that curiosity perfectly.”

Known for its terroir driven wines, Burgundy attracts drinkers who appreciate nuance and elegance. The region’s fresh acidity, moderate alcohol, and food friendly styles also suit both Kenya’s climate and its evolving dining culture, from grilled meats to seafood and cream based dishes.

Among Burgundy’s many producers, two houses stood out for different reasons. Bouchard Aîné & Fils, founded in Beaune

in 1750, is one of the most historic and recognisable names of the region, representing the classic face of Burgundy. Alongside this heritage stands Jean Claude Boisset, offering a more contemporary interpretation of Burgundy. Founded in 1961, the house is based in the striking Les Ursulines winery in Nuits Saint Georges, a former eighteenth century convent transformed into a modern winemaking space that blends history with contemporary architecture.

“What really works for our market is the range,” Beverly notes. “From Chablis and Mâconnais through to Côte de Beaune and Côte de Nuits, we can build an incredible Burgundy selection with a small group of outstanding producers.”

That selection was carefully curated. Price accessibility mattered, especially in a region often perceived as expensive. Label design

mattered too. Clean, consistent visuals help build recognition and confidence on shelves and wine lists. One of the biggest discoveries was how approachable the wines at the beginning of the range are. “They’re incredibly inviting,” Beverly says. “Great for by the glass, easy to enjoy, and very flexible with food.”

For those discovering Burgundy, Beverly keeps it simple. “Try a Chardonnay and a Pinot Noir from different villages and taste the difference. Burgundy is all about place, and that is what makes it so interesting.”

JEAN-CHARLES BOISSET

Jean-Charles Boisset was born in Vougeot, Burgundy, into one of France's most respected wine families. Raised among the historic vineyards of the Côte d'Or, he inherited not only a legacy of winemaking but a deep understanding of terroir, craftsmanship, and the responsibility of preserving heritage while moving it forward. His father, Jean-Claude Boisset, founded the family's Burgundy house, laying the foundation for what would become an internationally recognised wine group. Today, through the Boisset Collection, Jean-Charles has expanded that vision across Burgundy and California, uniting historic estates with a distinctive creative direction that blends monastic-rooted tradition with contemporary innovation.

In recognition of his influence on the global wine industry, Boisset was named Wine Enthusiast Wine Person of the Year, a testament to both his entrepreneurial impact and his ability to reimagine how fine wine is presented to modern audiences.

At the heart of his Burgundy portfolio are two distinguished houses. Bouchard Aîné & Fils, founded in 1750, represents 18th-century French elegance and refinement, producing wines that honour tradition while embracing contemporary precision. Jean-Claude Boisset, named in tribute to his father, reflects a modern interpretation of Burgundy, defined by architectural symmetry, meticulous vineyard selection, and a focus on purity of expression.

Together, these houses embody the dual spirit that defines Jean-Charles Boisset's career: respect for history, driven by relentless creativity.

A Conversation on Burgundy Creativity and the Future of Wine

Speaking with Jean-Charles Boisset is less like conducting an interview and more like stepping into a world of ideas. The Burgundy-born vintner moves easily between history, architecture, philosophy, and imagination, always returning to the same central point: wine is not simply a beverage. It is an experience.



Jean-Charles Boisset

Boisset was born in Vougeot, in the heart of Burgundy, surrounded by vineyards whose origins stretch back to medieval monasteries. His father, Jean-Claude Boisset, founded the family's Burgundy house in 1961. Today, Jean-Charles leads the Boisset Collection, a group of estates that spans Burgundy and California and includes some of the most historic wineries

in both regions. His influence on the modern wine world was recognised when Wine Enthusiast Magazine named him Wine Star "Person of the Year." Yet despite the global reach, Burgundy remains the foundation.

"Burgundy," he says, "is the ultimate refinement of the world of wine. Small,

beautiful, sophisticated. And it goes with every food on the planet."

It is a statement delivered with the confidence of someone who grew up inside the region's culture of precision. Burgundy's philosophy is simple but profound: great wines begin with place. "The monks understood this already in the

eleventh century,” Boisset explains. “They brought the vines to the best soils and created what we now call terroir. That idea still defines Burgundy today.”

Wine First. Always.

For Boisset, creativity in wine begins with a single rule: the wine itself must be extraordinary.

“The vertebral column is phenomenal wines,” he says. “If the wines are exceptional, then you can allow yourself to create the journey around them.”

That journey is something Boisset takes seriously. His wineries are not simply production sites. They are immersive spaces where architecture, design, and storytelling all play a role.

During the interview he briefly turns his camera to reveal a construction project in Napa Valley. Mosaic walls shimmer. Marble surfaces catch the light. “It’s like a jewellery box,” he says, smiling. “The goal is always the same. How do we

take wine to the next level?”

Yet he is quick to stress that the spectacle never replaces the wine itself.

“The experience works only because the wines are great. Without that, nothing else matters.”

Burgundy and California: Two Worlds, One Energy

One of the defining characteristics of the Boisset Collection is its presence in both Burgundy and California. On paper the two regions could not be more different. For Boisset, that contrast is precisely the point.

“Burgundy is anchored in centuries of tradition,” he says. “California brings innovation and freedom. The two feed each other.”

The relationship goes both ways. While Burgundy’s history provides a foundation, California contributes new ideas in viticulture, winemaking, and design.

“People sometimes think America learns everything from Burgundy,” he says. “But it’s not true. We learn from California as well. The exchange of ideas makes both stronger.”

The result is a portfolio that respects heritage while remaining open to evolution.

The Spirit of Burgundy

At the heart of the Burgundy portfolio are two houses that express different sides of the region.

Bouchard Aîné & Fils, founded in 1750, represents Burgundy’s classical tradition. “For me it captures the elegance of the eighteenth century,” Boisset explains. “The period of enlightenment. The period of refinement.”

When he describes the wines, he does not reach for technical language.

Instead he talks about atmosphere.

“I imagine someone opening a bottle of Bouchard in a beautiful setting. Elegant food. Good company. The wine should complement the experience, not overpower it.”

The wines are designed to work exactly that way: refined, expressive, and deeply connected to place.

Alongside it stands Jean-Claude Boisset, named in tribute to his father. Here the philosophy is more contemporary, focused on precision and clarity.

The cellars themselves reflect that thinking. Inspired by classical architectural proportion, they mirror the balance Boisset seeks in the wines.

Together, the two houses offer complementary perspectives on Burgundy. One expresses historic elegance. The other reflects modern interpretation.

Discovering Kenya

As the conversation turns to East Africa, Boisset’s enthusiasm becomes unmistakable.

“What excites me about Kenya is the energy,” he says. “Your enthusiasm. Your creativity. The sophistication of where the market is going.”

For him, the opportunity in Kenya is closely tied to the people building the wine culture on the ground.

“It’s not about being the biggest company,” he says. “It’s about being the mightiest. The most detail oriented.”

That way of thinking is exactly what he values in a partner. In Kenya, he sees that spirit in the De Vries Premium Wines team and their focused approach to building a portfolio of iconic producers.

“Africa has incredible cuisine, incredible culture, incredible creativity,” he says. “It’s the perfect time to discover that world through wine.”

The key, he believes, is ensuring that wine integrates with local culture rather than imposing foreign traditions. He points to Japan as an example, where Burgundy has found remarkable harmony alongside sashimi and sushi.

“The same thing can happen in Kenya,” he says. “Your herbs, your spices, your sauces. Burgundy can work beautifully with those flavours.” For Boisset, this kind of cultural connection is essential for any wine brand entering a new market. Wine should not feel imported in spirit, only in origin.

“It’s all about people,” he says simply. And in Kenya, he believes the right team is already in place.

Wine as a Sensory Experience

Perhaps the most distinctive aspect of Boisset’s philosophy is the way he speaks about wine as a multi-sensory experience.

When someone opens one of his bottles, he hopes it triggers imagination. “I want people to move beyond drinking to drink,” he says. “I want them to escape into ideas, imagination, flavours, places.”

Wine, in his view, should awaken every sense.

“You could imagine a garden. An orchard. Flowers. Fruit. Memories. That’s what wine should do.”

This belief in sensory storytelling has led him beyond wine itself. The Boisset universe now includes fragrance, design, architecture, and immersive tasting environments.

For him, they are all part of the same creative language.

The Power of Creation

Despite decades in the wine world, Boisset shows little sign of slowing down.



Creativity, he says, is what keeps him moving forward. “The moment I would not be inspired is death,” he says, laughing. “I would rather be resurrected as a snake, a peacock, or a swan.” It is a typically theatrical answer, but it captures his outlook perfectly. Each new project, winery, or idea becomes another chapter in a much larger story.

“I see the wineries almost like artists in a gallery,” he explains. “Each one has its own personality.”

Looking Ahead

When asked what he hopes people will say about the Boisset Collection decades from now, he pauses for a moment. “I hope they will say it was a portfolio of emotion,” he says finally. “Of history. Of heritage. Something that brought imagination and inspiration into people’s lives.”

With the arrival of Bouchard Aîné & Fils and Jean-Claude Boisset in Kenya, that vision begins a new chapter. For the Kenyan wine community, it is more than the introduction of two Burgundy houses.

It is an invitation to discover a world where wine, creativity, and culture meet.

Bouchard Aîné & Fils

Founded in 1750 in Beaune, Bouchard Aîné & Fils is one of Burgundy's most historic wine houses, known for producing elegant wines that highlight the finesse and diversity of the region's terroirs. We selected 16 wines for our Burgundy portfolio. Full list at the back.

Bouchard Aîné & Fils Héritage

The Héritage range expresses the classic character of Burgundy through approachable yet refined wines. The Chardonnay offers fresh aromas of citrus, white peach and delicate floral notes with lively acidity and a smooth, rounded finish. The Pinot Noir reveals bright red fruit aromas of cherry and raspberry with soft tannins, balanced structure and an elegant, fruit-driven palate.

Bouchard Aîné & Fils Bourgogne

The Bourgogne Chardonnay shows expressive aromas of white flowers, citrus and hints of honey, leading to a fresh palate with good acidity and subtle candied fruit notes. The Bourgogne Pinot Noir displays aromas of small red and black berries with a supple, round palate and gentle tannins, offering a classic and approachable expression of Burgundy.

Bouchard Aîné & Fils Chablis

A classic expression of Chablis with a pale golden colour and distinctive mineral character. Aromas of green apple, citrus and white fruit lead to a fresh and lively palate supported by bright acidity and a long, clean finish typical of this northern Burgundy appellation.





Jean-Claude Boisset

Jean-Claude Boisset was established in 1961 in Nuits-Saint-Georges and focuses on expressive wines crafted with respect for tradition and minimal intervention. Together, these houses represent the heritage and precision of Burgundian winemaking through classic Chardonnay and Pinot Noir styles.

Jean-Claude Boisset Les Ursulines / Savigny-Lès-Beaune 1er Cru Aux Guettes

The Les Ursulines Bourgogne Chardonnay presents delicate aromas of citrus, white fruit and flowers with freshness and elegance on the palate, while the Les Ursulines Bourgogne Pinot Noir shows vibrant red berry and blackcurrant notes with silky tannins and subtle oak complexity. The Savigny-Lès-Beaune 1er Cru Aux Guettes offers a deeper expression of Pinot Noir, revealing floral, smoky and mineral notes layered with ripe red fruit, refined tannins and a long, structured finish.





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Behind Every Bottle: Inside De Vries Operations

BEFORE a bottle ever reaches the table, it moves through a network of planning, coordination, and partnerships led by Veronica and the operations team at De Vries Premium Wines.

A long-standing member of the leadership team, Veronica oversees the operational backbone of the company, working closely with specialised partners to ensure customers receive their wines when they need them.

Today, De Vries imports wines and spirits from key producing regions across South Africa, Italy, the United States of America, New Zealand, Spain, Argentina, and France. These wines come from iconic producers around the world and form the core of the company's premium portfolio. Getting those bottles safely to Kenya

requires careful coordination across the entire supply chain.

"Our job is simple," Veronica explains. "We make sure the wines reach our customers in the same condition they left the winery." Wines are transported, stored, and handled in ways that protect their quality at every step.

"We take great care with how the wines move," she says. "The goal is always to preserve the integrity of the bottle."

Operations have evolved alongside Kenya's wine market.

"Consumers are far more informed now," she says. "People want to understand where a wine comes from, the grape, and how to enjoy it with food. We've seen strong growth in premium wines, especially in urban centres."

In the warehouse, bottles are stored carefully and stock is rotated to keep movement controlled and storage conditions stable. International shipping also brings its own realities. Port congestion, regulatory changes, and global events can all affect transit times and costs.

Recent geopolitical tensions, including conflict in the Middle East, have significantly increased shipping timelines and freight costs. Navigating those disruptions requires planning and close collaboration with trusted partners across the logistics chain.

For Veronica, operations always comes back to one thing. "Everything we do is about the customer," she says. "Making sure they have the wines they need, when they need them."



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Be Noble. Drink Responsibly

Prafulla Enterprises: Strong Partnerships in Bonded Warehousing



STRONG logistics depend on strong partnerships. For De Vries Premium Wines, Prafulla Enterprises Limited plays a vital role in bonded storage, safely holding wines prior to tax clearance.

As part of the De Vries operational network, Prafulla provides specialised bonded warehousing where wines are securely stored before entering the Kenyan market. From this facility, De Vries also re-exports wines to several neighbouring East African markets, making the bonded warehouse an important hub within the regional supply chain.

“Our responsibility is to ensure wines are stored under the right conditions and released on time,” Mahesh explains. “Meeting tight deadlines, especially for urgent shipments, is a challenge we genuinely enjoy solving.” Working with best-in-class specialists is

central to the De Vries operations strategy. Each partner brings deep expertise in their field, allowing the company to maintain high service levels for customers. Over time, the relationship with Prafulla has grown into a close operational partnership.

Among the shipments Mahesh remembers most were containers carrying wines from SAS Perrin et Fils and Vergelegen. Significant delays during transit meant arrival timelines shifted repeatedly. By working closely together and coordinating storage and release schedules, both teams managed to recover part of the

lost time and ensure wines still reached customers as planned. Moments like these highlight how important strong operational partnerships are. Behind every bottle reaching the table is a network of experienced teams working together to make it happen.



In Safe Hands: The role of FIT in Wine Logistics

wines leave the warehouse safely and on time.

Technology also supports transparency across the operation. FIT's customised SCM Profit Portal provides real-time visibility on stock levels, movements, balances, and billing milestones.

What makes wine logistics different, Brian says, is how sensitive the product can be.

"Shipping wine isn't just transporting a product," he says. "You're protecting the work that went into making it." For the logistics teams involved, the objective is straightforward: make sure every bottle arrives ready to be enjoyed.

Wine logistics is about far more than moving boxes from one place to another. At FIT, it means protecting quality, preserving brand value, and ensuring every bottle reaches the market exactly as intended.

FIT has supported De Vries Premium Wines since the early days of the company in 2015, forming one of the key operational partnerships behind the business. Brian and his team work closely with De Vries on a full end-to-end logistics basis, coordinating each stage of the supply chain to ensure efficiency, accuracy, and care at every touchpoint.

FIT forms a central part of the wider De Vries operations network, working alongside other specialised partners across warehousing, bonded storage, and customs clearance.

From the moment wines arrive, the process is hands-on. Inbound logistics include careful planning, physical inspections, and documentation checks to confirm product conformity.

Once received, wines are stored using structured put-away processes that support accurate inventory control, stock rotation, and safe custody.

"Storage and handling are critical," Brian explains. "Every step is designed to protect the wine, from how it's stacked to how it's moved."

Operational execution follows with equal precision. Orders are picked, packed, labelled, and staged according to detailed pick instructions and delivery timelines. Outbound logistics then take over, with supervised loading onto delivery vehicles supported by security personnel to ensure

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A Partnership Forged in Resilience

As the original clearing and logistics partner for De Vries Africa Consulting Ltd, Apple Logistics Limited has played an integral role in the company's journey since 2015, clearing the very first shipment and every shipment that has followed.

Handling the importation of premium wines and spirits into Kenya requires precision, regulatory expertise, and careful coordination.

From excise compliance to customs documentation and port logistics, the supply chain behind every bottle is complex and tightly regulated. From the beginning, Apple Logistics has been a key operational partner within the wider De Vries network.

Their first shipment together, a 20-foot container arriving through Mombasa, remains particularly memorable. Shortly after leaving the port, the truck suffered a tyre puncture at Taru, causing the vehicle to veer off the road and the container to roll onto its side. It was an unexpected start to the partnership.

Fortunately, the shipment was covered by Goods in Transit insurance as well as Marine insurance arranged by De Vries. Although the incident caused delays and financial loss, the insurance helped cover the damage and allowed both companies to move forward.

For Apple Logistics, the experience became an important lesson. It led to stronger safety procedures and tighter operational controls that still guide their work today.

As Kibe reflects, how a company handles a crisis often says more about a partnership than a hundred routine deliveries. The fact that the relationship has continued



to grow since 2015 reflects shared resilience, trust, and a long-term approach to building the business together.

Nearly a decade later, the collaboration continues to move forward.
