Process To Enter:

- Open to all LMA members in good standing. Submit works no older than 3 years. A limit of two works entered.
- Registration: Effective now and ends April 29, 2020
- Complete the LMA application form as usual with info and jpgs.
- Write an appropriate inspirational quote from a prominent person or write an original one in the space provided for each submission. See the example below.

All information will be publicized. If you do not wish to have your contact information such as your email or cell phone, then leave that area blank. Know that your work will be offered for sale and like most of our exhibitions, sales will be the responsibility of the artist. In other words, the buyer will contact you to purchase your work. The artist will be responsible for all taxes, contacting the potential buyer and delivery. The Exhibition Chair will have her info available as an additional contact for sales. There will be no commissions taken.

Yes, this is a very unique, out of the box venture. As artists we have the ability to set free thoughts of concern. This is an unusual time and we can instill serenity and hope by showing our art and inspirational thoughts to the world through social media. By this unique exhibition we can reach out to others and show how creativity is alive and well. Cheer, hope and happiness are still at hand.
