Course Description:

This <u>Non-Language Specific</u> Three (3) credit hour, <u>Non-Instructor led course</u>, will familiarize today's Interpreter with common terms and meanings associated with current Gang & Street Crime Terminology. "Plug", "Yard", "Set", "Strapped" are just a few of the hundreds of terms and acronyms currently used by California and other street gangs in states across the US and which often end up being part of court proceedings and testimony by witnesses, suspects and victims. Through a combination of provided video resources, self-guided terminology exploration, definition/word matching and photo/term matching and "True & False" questions, the language professional can expect to gain a better understanding of terminology and phrases commonly and not so commonly used in today's courtrooms. This course will require the Interpreter to have the means to access the internet to research and discover the terminology contained within the Non-Instructor led class, This "self research" in turn, will allow the Interpreter to select the correct answer given in the course.
