On our roster of members and regular attenders I counted 26 of us who have lost our mates. Sometimes that loss comes slowly. Sometimes it comes suddenly. Never is it easy. My loss came suddenly. Suzy has struggled with health issues throughout our life together. Early on she was diagnosed with Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. She also developed chemical and airborne sensitivities. In recent years she developed diabetes and high blood pressure. A brain scan revealed that at some point she had a couple of "ministrokes." This had resulted in a bit of dementia. I had no expectation that these things would lead to her sudden demise.

Suzy used to worry about what would happen to her if something happened to me--- death or incapacitation. In that sense I am grateful that she passed before I did. Because of my Biblical convictions life has to be much better for her than it was in this earthly life. (Hopefully she does miss me. I certainly miss her.) Also I have no doubt that I will see her again. There will be some great reunions in the future.

I am sad but not depressed. As a pastor I have learned that people mourn in different ways. I will stay engaged and involved with work and people. I find benefit in focusing on others and not myself. I have enough time alone at night in an empty bedroom. I am thankful to have son Bart living at home with me.

I am proud of my church family. You have learned how to respond to people with significant losses. I had multiple church leaders showing up at my house within minutes of my loss. I have been inundated with cards and expressions of support. People have graciously provided meals and gift cards and other measures of support. The funeral seemed to be honoring to the Lord and Suzy and certainly was supportive of us. Almost the entire Boulder City ministerial association showed up. Southwest Diner found out about our loss and provided food for the reception at no cost to us.

I especially appreciate the prayers that have been directed toward heaven for me and our family. They have no doubt had a significant part in enabling us to persevere through this with some measure of stability. I have received genuine assurances of prayer from relatives, church people, neighbors, friends from college, friends from seminary, friends from previous churches. I have heard from friends in Canada, Sweden, Belgium, the Netherlands, Northern Ireland, China, Nepal, and Brazil, as well as various parts of the US.

Life will obviously be different for me. It will take some time to work this out. I may have more freedom in what I do with my time. I appreciate your support.
