Denice was sworn into the delayed entry program of the United States Air Force during her senior year of high school. Her basic training was at Lackland AFB in San Antonia, Texas. The first duty station was Scott AFB near Fairfield, IL where she worked in the 375th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron on the C-9 Nightingale, a medical evacuation plane. Denice was deployed to Iraq for 5 ½ months during Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Upon returning to the USA Denice served six years at Travis AFB in CA and received the National Defense Service Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal. Denice separated as a Senior Airman E-4. Denise is a dual member of Fred Hilburn Post/Unit 11 in Douglas. Thank you for your service Denise

UAV UNOFFICIAL MINUTES 4 MAY 2019

The meeting was called to order by Director Lee Seago at 10:00 a.m. The opening ceremony was conducted and guests introduced.

Glenn T. Gray, Director, Customer Care & Community Relations, TriWest Healthcare Alliance gave an update on upcoming changes to the Choice Program. The Choice Program will be going away and a new program PC3 will be in effect starting 7 June 2019. Any choice programs will flip to the PC3. TriWest's area of responsibility has been expanded. The handle VA cases from Nashville on the east to Hawaii in the west. They serve 1.6 million veterans and have processed over 16 million claims nationwide. They have 17,000 providers.

Romaldo Gonzelez from "Valor's on 8th" briefed the members on his program which started about a year ago. Their focus is on veterans that are unable to run, get out of bed, and do thing for themselves. They want to help these veterans get back into the community. They get tickets for sports events and make arrangements to take these veterans. They have 150 tickets for the upcoming Washington Nationals vs the D-Backs. To find out about upcoming events cll 602-748-0254 or cell 602-483-0765. They also work with veterans coming off of active duty, trying to make their transition as easy as possible. They offer assistance with the Veteran's Court and other community services.

Dr. Kris Volcheck, Founder and Executive Director for "Brighter Way Institute" works with veterans by offering low cost dental care. Valor's on 8th: "Engaging with Veterans one event at a time." Brighter Way Institute is a non-profit organization which has been offering dental care to veterans for many years, and currently has great very low-cost programs for veterans. Roll call was taken, a quorum was established. Carol Culbertson motioned to accept the minutes as written, second and approved.

Treasurer's report was unavailable.

Judith Hatch gave an update on the Memorial Day Program. The construction has been postponed until the middle of June so the parking for VIP's and participants should not be a problem. She reminded everyone to arrive early due to the backup on Cave Creek Road every year.

Director Rima Nelson, VA Medical Center, announced that Deputy Director Sean Branski has been selected for the Director's position in the VA Medical Center, Danville, IL. Sean will be leaving the middle of May to accept this appointment.

The Mission Act which President Trump signed into law last June becomes effective this June. It will take seven different types of programs and streamline them into one. It also provides support for the care giver program. It expands the care giver program to all era veterans, not just Post 9-11. Eligibility will change. If you live more than a 30 minute drive time you can go in the community.

An exoskeleton device was donated to the VA to help paralyzed veterans stand and walk again. The Veterans Resource Center continues to help veterans in a more timely manner. They can address all questions and problems. Over 2400 veterans have been serviced so far.

Director Nelson met with the Mayo Clinic to see if they would be willing to have some of their interns serve some of their time at the VA Hospital. They agreed and several interns have spent some of their internship at the VA. They were very impressed with some of the modern equipment they were able to train on and when they went back told the Mayo Clinic that when they completed their internship they were hoping to get a job at the VA. Director Nelson also got the Mayo Clinic to agree to once again accept veteran patients for situations that the VA is unable to handle.

The VA is planning on a number of Town Hall Meetings throughout the state. They will be held at various American Legion Post.

David Lucier gave an update on our attempts to get a Fisher House in Phoenix. Things are going well but he is still looking for more letters of support. The next step will be to locate and buy the land.

Jessica Roza, Military and Veterans Community Liaison for Congresswoman Debbie Lesko advise the members that Congresswoman Lesko has co-sponsored a bill that would repeal the Widow's Tax signed into law this past year.

Terry Araman, Legislative Chairman updated the membership on the status of a number of veteran's issue bills. HB2488 "Suicide Reporting" has been signed by the Governor.

HB2093 – Requesting 12 more Veterans Counselors for the State has been held up in budget negotiations. Members are encouraged to write letters to the Governor in support of this issue. With the increase in the veterans community due to the current world situation, the current Veterans Counselors are over taxed. There were 2 bills, one in Senate and one in the House to change deduction taxation on Veteran's retirement, both bills have fallen off the map.

The AVHOF Induction Ceremony will be Saturday, October 18th.

There will be a special presentation at the WWI memorial at Wesley Bolin Plaza on Saturday, May 18th at 11:00 a.m.

There being no further information to come before the membership, the closing ceremony was held and the meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p..m.
