DESCRIPTION: The very RARE Pearson H-30 was the top model of Pearson's popular H-Series. It was only made one year (1969), then slightly changed and renamed the Sierra Stalker. It is similar in design to the famed Mercury Hunter, but a lighter and without the mercury capsules. The bow has sweeping recurved limbs which gives it additional speed. This is a great looking high performance recurve. Freijo riser. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines or crazing. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is in very good shape. Overall, this is a really nice bow in excellent minty condition. This bow was put to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours to make sure the old glues still held and no stress cracks developed. Then taken to the range and test shot. Comes with a new rug rest and side plate, and a new string.

This bow sold for \$80 in 69, which translates to \$703 in 2025 inflation adjusted dollars.
