ORDINANCE NO. 21

An Ordinance Licensing and Regulating the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor, and Providing a Penalty for the Violation

The Council of the Village of New Munich do Ordain:

Section 1. Provision of State Law Adopted. That all definitions, terms and provisions regulating the sale of intoxivating liquor as provided for by Chapter 46 of the Special Session Laws of 1933-1934 and all amendments thereof are hereby adopted and made a part of this ordinance, the same as if set forth verhatim herein.

Section2. Application for License. Every person desiring a license shall file a verified application therefor, in writing with the Village Clerk, said application for "off-sale" license to be in form to be prescribed by the Liquor Control Commissioner of the State of Minnesota and with such additional provisions as the village council may require, and for "onsale" license shall be the form prescribed by the village council. A corporate surety bond shall accompany each application for license. In the case of an appli-cation for "on-sale" license it shall be accompanied by a surety bond in the sum of \$3,000.00 to be approved as to legal form and as to its sufficiency by the Village Council, or in lieu thereof cash or United States government bonds, and in case of an application for "offsale" license it shall be accompanied by a surety bond in the sum of \$1,000.00, to be approved by the Village Council and the Liquor Control Commissioner, or in lieu thereof cash or United States gov-ernment bonds. All bonds shall be continuing as to any violation or damages resulting therefrom during the period of | said licenses. That in the event of arviolation of the provisions of any largeluting to the retail "off-sale" and retail "on-sale" of intoxicating liquor, such bond shall be forfeited to the village of New Munich.

Section 3. Fees. All applications for license shall be accompanied by a receipt from the village treasurer for the required annual fee for the respective license. All such fees shall be paid into the general fund of the village. Upon rejection of any application for a license. the treasurer shall refund the amount paid and the bond of said applicant shall be returned to him. The annual fee for an "on-sale" license shall be \$400.00. The annual fee for an "off-sale" license shall be \$75.00. All license shall expire on the last day of June in each year. For licenses issued hereunder prior to June 30, 1934, the fee shall be a pro rata share

of the annual license fee.
Section 4. Granting of Licenses. The
village council shall cause an investigation to be made of all the representations set forth in the application. After such investigation and approval of the required bond, the village council shall grant or refuse such license in its discre-tion; provided that np "off-sale" license shall become effective until it, together with the bond, have the approval of the Liquor Control Commissioner. All IIcensed premises shall have the license posted in a conspicuous place therein at all times. No license shall be transferable either as to license or premises without the approval of the council and also of the Liquor Control Commissioner in the case of "off-sale" licenses. No license shall be granted for operation in any premises against which there are any delinquent real estate taxes. No license shall be granted to any person personally indebted to the Village of New Munich. Tobacco, cigarettes, cigars, candies, ice

Section2. Application for License. Every person desiring a license shall file a verified application therefor, in writing with the Village Clerk, said application for "off-sale" license to be in form to be prescribed by the Liquor Control Commissioner of the State of Minnesota and with such additional provisions as the village council may require, and for "onsale" license shall be the form prescribed by the village council. A corporate surety bond shall accompany each application for license. All bonds shall be continuing as to any violation or damages resulting therefrom during the period of said licenses. That in the event of ar violation of the provisions of any la. relating to the retail "off-sale" and retail "on-sale" of intoxicating liquor, such bond shall be forfeited to the village of

New Munich. Section 3. Fees. All applications for license shall be accompanied by a receipt from the village treasurer for the required annual fee for the respective license. All such fees shall be paid into the general fund of the village. Upon rejection of any application for a license, the treasurer shall refund the amount paid and the bond of said applicant shall be returned to him.
