Notes from the Center - Kitchen Edition

Your Senior Center has two cooks, kitchen coordinator, several kitchen aides, and a team of meal delivery drivers. <u>Each day</u>, our kitchen produces more than 400 Meals on Wheels, and 20-100 Congregate, lunches. The kitchen is the heart of our work!

Kitchen coordinator, Sandra Dickerson, was with the Center for 11 years and retired in June. She planned menus with input from expert nutritionists, placed food orders, coordinated storage, then observed preparation and portioning of the Meals on Wheels and Congregate lunches.

Della Layton, kitchen aide and Meals on Wheels driver, has been with us 2 years, holds a degree in restaurant management, and has 16 years experience managing a chain restaurant. Her gifts include food prep and baking cakes for Congregant lunch.

New on the scene are Joy Smith celebrating two months and Tracy Garrett who will celebrate one month of service in July.

While Joy has experience serving a LOT of family, this is her first time cooking for more than 100 on a daily basis. "I'm so happy to be here, serving alongside a wonderful staff", says Joy. "Our seniors are wonderful and I really love it here!"

Tracy recently served St Catherine's, a skilled nursing facility in Washington Court House — and it served well — for 13 years. "I was concerned, being the youngest on staff and not yet being

licensed, but I've fit right in!"

With Sandra's retirement, Tracy, Joy, and Della are collaborating and switching up the division of duties to explore their skillsets.

"It's wonderful, to get to use the gifts of my experience and degree, here at the Center," said Della.



# **Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program**

(OSHIIP) provides Medicare beneficiaries with free, objective health insurance information, one-on-one counseling, and educates consumers about Medicare, Medicare prescription drug coverage (Part D), Medicare Advantage options, Medicare supplement insurance.

OSHIIP is funded by a federal grant and by the state of Ohio. The Ohio Department of Insurance in Columbus administers the program. In 2019, OSHIIP:

- Counseled more than 435,000 people
- Saved Ohio consumers \$32 million
- Distributed more than 1,000,000 publications
- Trained and certified more than 2,600 community-based volunteers
- Established more than 20 information sites and is a proud member of: Ohio Medicare Partners, Ohio's Aging Eye Public/Private Partnership, and a national network of similar state programs

Free services are available from OSHIIP, specifically for those enrolled or eligible for Medicare.

Representatives will answer your questions about any of the matters listed below:

- Medicare health coverage for seniors and for people under age 65 with disabilities.
- Medicare prescription drug plans.
- Medicare Advantage Plans (example: HMOs and PPOs).
- Medicare supplemental insurance.
- Financial assistance programs for people with limited income.
- · Long-term care insurance.

#### Thursday, <u>July</u> 6, 8am-12pm!

The Summer Crisis Program provides assistance with an electric bill, help with the cost of central AC repair, and/or purchase of a window AC or fan. Eligible households include an elderly member (age 60+), or provide physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health.

#### TO SIGN UP, BRING:

- birth certificates or social security cards: <u>all members</u> of household
- last 30 days household income, including SSI, unemployment, wages, etc
- most recent utility bill(s)
- if applicable, a doctor signed certificate


