BOB HAYES, VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Bob started ski instructing in Northern California in the late 80's and volunteered briefly with disabled skiers through University of California in the early 90's but got sidetracked for a couple decades. About 5 years ago, Bob's friend and ski buddy, **Dean Francois**, told him about The Unrecables and invited him to join. Bob Hayes been an avid contributor to the group ever since.

Bob started skiing at age 5 here in southern California mountains, and then at age 9, he moved to the North Chicago suburbs where he continued skiing in various Wisconsin resorts such as Wilmot and Alpine Valley. Bob joined his school ski team and competed at Wilmot, but he was skiing on his original skis, which were far too old and short to compete effectively.

So, Bob convinced his older brother to let him borrow his new set of Hart Billy Kidd skis, and he won his very next race, a first. As such, Bob became very attached to those skis and a big fan of **Billy Kidd**, who happens to be an advisory board member of The Unrecables.

Fast forward to 2023, Bob was skiing in Steamboat Colorado, and tried to get a hold of Billy. The often-quoted adage, "Never meet your he-

roes" absolutely does not apply to Billy Kidd. Billy met Bob at the Steamboat lodge, and was thrilled to sign his skis. While only planned to be a few minutes for a meet-and-greet, Billy spent over an hour with Bob and the Steamboat staff discussing past victories, ski equipment development, and all the recent progress with adaptive sports.

Amusingly, the only interruption was when Billy got a phone call from fellow legendary skier Franz Klammer, which obviously, he had to take. Listening to that conversation was like being a fly on the wall while two of the most celebrated skiers in history chatted about an upcoming fundraising event.

When asked what is his main motivation for volunteering is, Bob answered that it is for very selfish reasons: he enjoys it and it makes him a better skier. When working with students, especially those with physical limitations, instructors need to be their sharpest to discern how to improve body movement and turn shape.

Plus, students, instructors, and volunteers in the adaptive world, from sports heroes to first-timers, make for a great community of which Bob feels privileged to belong. ♦

Saturday Randy gave us tips on how to instruct VI students, then we brought out the Mountain Man bi-ski and went through its operation. After that we took it out to the Discovery lift with no one in it for the first couple runs. Then Kenny became the "Crash Test Dummy" for Victor and Dave (on his snowboard!) for bucket assisting and tethering practice for several runs. It was great to see Dave get some experience as he had never boarded with a bi-ski. There were no major mishaps, but Dave did have to prevent his Apple watch from calling 911...



Saturday evening after a carne asada taco dinner at the condo, we went to Mammoth's Night of Lights event at Canyon Lodge with Dave rockin' his new ugly Christmas sweater. What a difference this year in the weather! Last year was cold and windy as the storm passed, this year the weather was calm and clear.
