The Wierciochs begin preparing for the food drive each year the day after Thanksgiving. They shop area stores and markets, including Martin's, Aldi's, GFS, and many others to ensure that each family receives as many groceries as possible. This year each basket included canned goods, cereal, bakery goods, and a whole ham, along with much more. With the help of approximately 120 volunteers, the Wierciochs and the Knights were able to make the holiday season a little brighter for many families.



Gibault School, a private residential treatment facility located three miles south of Terre Haute, Indiana, on Highway #41, was established in 1921 by the **Indiana Knights of Columbus** as a refuge for wayward boys. Throughout the years, Gibault has undergone many transformations, both physically and programmatically, to meet the ever-changing needs of troubled children, between the ages of 8 and 18. Today, Gibault is a 126-bed residential treatment facility that has provided life-changing opportunities for over 7400 young people and their families.

Gibault is a child care agency licensed by the Indiana Division of Family and Children. It is accredited by the Council on Accreditation and is a member of the Child Welfare League of America. Additionally, Gibault can issue a high school diploma or general education diploma. As their mission statement says, "Gibault provides life-changing opportunities for children, families, and communities."



During the 19 years, 1535 roses have been presented. The cost for the roses has been \$3600 and is shared by the Knights of Columbus and the Daughters of Isabella.



Children's Christmas Party Dateline: North Pole


