

2020 General Election Information

Update: 08/27/20

Pursuant to Assembly Bill 4 that was passed during the 32nd Special Session of the Nevada Legislature, all active registered voters will be mailed an official mail ballot for the November 3, 2020 General Election. All regular polling locations will be available for in-person voting on Election Day. Early voting will be available October 17-30, 2020. Voters will have the option to either vote by mail or in person.

Mail ballots may be dropped off at the Clerk's office, during Early Voting or any Election Day polling location. Ballot drop boxes will also be available at the Carlin, Elko, Wells and West Wendover City Clerk's Offices during their normal business hours October 19-29, 2020.

The Clerk's Office is working closely with the United States Postal Service to ensure the timely delivery of the mail ballots.

If you choose to vote in person, you may bring your mail ballot to surrender to the election workers at the polling place or, if you do not bring your mail ballot, you must sign an Affirmation prior to voting.

Voters are required to wear a face mask when voting in person. Please be aware that there may be long lines at the polling locations because the check-in process will be longer. All polling locations will be in compliance with social distancing requirements and all election equipment will be sanitized. Voters will be asked to use hand sanitizer prior to voting on a machine.

Nevada residents with a disability can mark their ballot electronically by going to www.nvEASE.gov.

The Clerk's Office is receiving a high number of inquiries regarding third-party mailings notifying voters that they may not be registered to vote. Please note these notices are not coming from the Clerk's Office.
