French Lick Town Green

Everyone is putting forth a great effort. It appears we will be ready for the roofer to get us in the dry ahead of the anticipated date. I'm trying to convince the owners on the Town Green end to housewrap the building. I would like to insulate the envelope of the building and get some temporary heat going to get the building to an acceptable moisture level before hanging sheet rock.

Orange County Courthouse

The copper roof & PVC trim is all but done. We will need 3 or 4 good days to complete exterior painting. The windows are scheduled to arrive on 11/25 and once we have them installed that should complete the exterior with the exception of landscape work. K&M Plastering is making great time and should have the plaster work complete soon. Our next big hurdle will be the tin

French Lick Casino—Addition

We have nearly completed our bid portion of the job. It seems that the new dome & dome support steel may have to move because of a conflict with a rooftop air handler. They have asked for some additional help with metal stud framing & hanging Penz glass, so Robert, Dan & Tyler are on temporary loan.

Denny's Restaurant

We almost have the LV side dried in and anticipate this work to start before Christmas.

Russellville Project

Bid portion is complete. We just need to install some change order railings. They have also asked for a price for one more additional railing & a drive way approach to be poured.
