Ali's Adventure in Saudi Arabia



Adler's Gallery Night

LCAL members Skip Wiese and Paulette Colo are among eight artists featured in a September/October show at the David Adler Music and Arts Center. The theme of the show is "Body and Soul." An opening reception will be Friday, September 13, 6:00-8:00 pm with wine and music. On Wednesday, October 2nd, Adler will host a "Gallery Night" when the artists "walk us through the galleries and share stories about their creative process."

This Adler Gallery Night is a "must see" event for those who want to better understand what five of our members will be expected to do at February's much anticipated "Adler Invitational." Adler will invite five LCAL artists based only on the one piece of art each has submitted at our Fall Membership Show. Each artist will display up to eight pieces. Under a new Adler Gallery Night format, the artists will together develop a theme for Adler publicity, and later speak to the theme as it relates to much of the art displayed.

Paulette says that Gallery Night is popular with many galleries. "People do want to know the process and the inspiration." Since the September/October show is "mostly figuratively based," she will talk about her considerable experience and love of figurative art.

"I find the human figure, no matter shape, size, color or gender a beautiful creation which deserves to be captured in art." That becomes very personal because her background is non-academic and "more hands on." As a young person Paulette drew incessantly from magazines "to train my eye and learn anatomy," and now she sketches from life whenever the opportunity arises. Twice a week she does pencil sketches of live models with two different groups, and later afternoons are spent painting in oil from figure studio sketches and supplemental photos.

For her Adler Gallery Night Paulette will say something to the effect that "The paintings I've submitted in this exhibit are real people who have modeled for me and allowed me to take some photos for reference. Sometimes I choose the actual settings as background but others I embellish or create my own. For instance, my piece "Medusa", was a model's face but her dreadlocks reminded me of snakes in her hair like Medusa so I played on that." There is another piece of rather nondescript hairless figures with no features and all in dark blue leotards. "These were manikins for sale at the clothing stores in the mall but they conveyed a sense of loneliness and separation that prompted me to paint them. I call the piece 'No-ones'".

(Make-up class Sat. Nov 30 or Dec 7...to be determined)


