To me. **The second part** of what God has been teaching me lately was best worded in a sermon I heard recently that reminded me of what I have often seen play out in life: "Good and evil run in parallel tracks and often arrive in our lives at the same time." That is so unbelievable true for me and so true in the lives of the women we minister to. So often something beautiful and good God is bringing our way, or bringing to the life of the women we serve, has something overtly evil hot on it's trail waiting to distract and derail. This is truly the message we speak from our classroom, from our conversations with the women and families we serve as we know with painful awareness that there is so much at stake in their lives as they are forced to choose everyday whom they will serve- the very same choice that each and every one of us make the second our eyes peel open at the dawn of each day. Who will I serve and how will I spend the next 12-18 hours? The real, everyday choices of life.

Moment to moment. Hour to hour. Decade to decade.

Ashes to ashes. Dust to dust.

The little choices pave the way to life-shaping, destiny-ushering realities that not only impact the life of the one making the choices, but the generations thereafter and that of the entire circle of influence. **A heavy reality indeed.**

Furthermore, these choices of immense impact almost always disguise themselves as insignificant daily decisions whose true power can often only be fully appreciate in hindsight with either incredible relief and gratitude or the deepest of regret and pain. I can promise you that here at The Soulutions Center we will always instruct the women we serve to lead their lives in a way that leads to more abundance and less regret as God's Word never steers us into a direction of harm.

Please pray as we gear up to head into a fresh month of teaching, leading, serving and loving that God will break through the chains that bind so many hearts. I would be lying if I said that here at the ministry, 2018 wasn't especially painful in many ways as we saw a lot really awful choices and consequences play out in the lives of those we love and serve here. **My hope is that 2019** will be a year of transformation that is nothing short of astounding and that we will be pointed to areas of greatest need and greatest impact as we serve Him together and see Him do more than we could ever ask or imagine.
