Larry was able to negotiate a 50% reduction, making the building rental rate for the weekend \$1275. He has contacted Bennett Rental for chairs and tables as their rental rate is better than what the fairgrounds could offer. Friday setup, overnight camping and an outside food vendor were all okayed for this year. Discussion on alternatives for next year. This will be an ongoing topic for the Board. Wayne Larson volunteered to be the second contact for the fair contract.
- Larry will rent a 26 foot U Haul trailer for 4 days starting on Thursday.

He also showed some of the equipment he uses that would be safe for the kids to use as well. (with supervision, of course) He invited anyone who is interested in giving it a try to come over with a parent and he'd be happy to help them.

Mr. Carl Miles brought various rocks to give to the junior members.

Mineral of the Month Reports:

Stillbite by Greyson, age 10

Stilbite is the name of a series of tectosilicate minerals of the zeolite group. Prior to 1997, stilbite was recognized by a mineral species. Stilbite has many different colors like green, blue, white, and orange.

Stillbite by Marcus, age 10

Stilbite is a powerful mineral which is a member of the zeolite family. It helps with psychic knowing and intuition. It is also used for psychic direction and guidance from guides, guardian angels and totem animals. stilbite is also a powerful stone in creativity that enhances creative energy. That is all folks for my report!

Stilbite by Sage, age 7

Stilbite is a zeolite, meaning it has aluminum atoms in a crystal structure and it is also a silicate mineral, meaning that it has silicon and oxygen forming a crystal matrix inside it's structure. Stilbit often happens in groups of twinned crystals that can range in color from white or yellow to reddish brown. Stilbite has a hardness of 3.5 to 4 and a specific gravity of 2.1.

Heulandite by Sawyer, age 8

Heulandite is from the zeolites group it is a hydrated calcium sodium aluminum silicate mineral and can be found in basalt cavities. Heulandite creates sprays of complex translucent crystals and can range in color. They can be clear, white, pink, yellow, green, gray, brown and black. Heulandite is often mistaken as stilbite. It has a harness of 3.5-4. It can be found in many places around the world, but most notable is that it can be found right here in Washington.

Calcite by Lukas, age 12

Calcite is a carbonate mineral that has a hardness of 3 on the Mohs scale and can be the color white, gray, yellow and green. This mineral or rock is very brittle and is transparent. This rock is found in Germany, England, Canada, China and Mexico. In conclusion, calcite crystal is a very cool rock.

I am interested in making a tumbler that can polish large rocks up to 12 inches or more and I am wondering if there might be some members who would be interested in building a large vibratory tumbler with me. I have seen pictures and some video of homemade ones that we could use as a starting point. I would be glad to work on more than one if there is anyone interested in working with me so that we each would have one when we are done.



2016 SILENT AUCTION RULES

- A silent auction round will be 30 minutes in duration. The first of the day will end at 10:45 am, so as not to interfere with the calling of door prizes.
- No bidding while working behind the tables.
- All items must be paid for at the end of the auction round & there will be no storing of materials for club members behind the tables.
- No socializing with non-workers behind the tables.
- The chairs behind the tables are for the auction-workers use only.

4) Half-Day Auctions:

- There will two half-day auctions each day for higher value items, and a limit of two items per family, per auction for each session unless there is a shortage of material for the table.
- The bid sheets for the 1/2 day auctions are on colored paper, the 1/2 hour auctions on white. Please print your name clearly on the slip as well as what the item is.
- A minimum bid may be placed on an item, but as of the February Show/Board meeting, the payout on sales has been changed to a straightforward 70% to owner, 30% to club. If you want a certain amount for your item, please figure out that amount in your 70% return and write that on your slip as the opening bid. If you have any questions regarding this new payout, please contact Chris Sorensen.

If an item does not sell, it will be removed from the table and set aside for another sale round or set aside for the owner to claim later.

5) Consignment Sales:

- Items may be consigned to sell at the half-hour auctions. Fill out a white bid sheet and attach it to the item with a rubber band or tape. Print your name clearly and check the "consignment" box on the sheet. If no box is checked, it is assumed that it is a donation. Bid slips will be available at the April meeting so club members can prepare their items for sale.
- All half-hour items for sale will begin with a \$1.00 opening bid. Please mark your slips accordingly.
- Consigned items are split 70% to the club member and 30% to the club.
