From the Pastor's Study

Friendship Sunday

On Sunday, November 14, we will celebrate friendship Sunday! Please invite a friend or two to join you for worship that morning. However, I hope that you don't invite them because St. John's needs more members. During the Twentieth Century, congregations grew so rapidly that it was difficult to keep up with the growth, both in terms of space and staffing. As this trend reversed during the last 30 years or so, many congregations have found it increasingly difficult to maintain buildings and staffing that were needed by larger congregations. Consequently, much of what passes for outreach is

nothing more than attempts to replenish the ranks of church members. These attempts mostly fail, perhaps because our motives are wrong. God calls us to reach our neighbors with the good news of Jesus Christ for their sakes — not ours. We invite the people we know to worship, not because we need them to refill our shrinking congregations, but in order that they may receive the precious gifts of God granted in the Divine Service. Christian outreach is rooted in our desire to bless our neighbors, not so they can be a blessing to us. Who are the people in your life whom you would love to see our Savior welcome into His fold? If it's possible, please ask if you can pick them up or meet them in the parking lot, as it can be pretty daunting to visit a church for the first time.

Advent Series: "Angels of Christmas"

While I sometimes tease that God must have made my guardian angel during the war, when He was having trouble getting parts, angels are as real as you and me. The Bible doesn't teach us that each of us has a guardian angel assigned to us, but this does not mean that angels are nonexistent in our lives. The Bible has much to say about angels, particularly in the passages leading up to the birth of our Lord. 

From the Administrative Assistant's Desk....

My apologies for the delay on getting this started.
I am, as they say, experiencing technical difficulties.
However, in the next weeks St. John's will begin
offering a new method for giving your offering to the church: Vanco (kind of like PayPal, but for church giving.) Right now I'm working with our Treasurer Monica Vander Kooi to get our account set up, learn how to use it, and then

find the easiest ways for our members to access this new process.

I want to emphasize a few things. First, this site is a SECURE website, and we are partnering directly with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund to make sure the system is effective for St. John's. Second, and I cannot stress this enough: If you DON'T want to use electronic giving for church, that is perfectly fine!! We don't want anyone to feel like they're being forced to use something that makes them in any way uncomfortable. Rather, we're presenting options for those who find electronic giving to be easier, or who want to cut down on handling envelopes, paper, and pens in a public setting due to health concerns. If Vanco appeals to you, and you want to use it, we'll be here to help you. If it's something you want to try later on, we'll be happy to assist you then. And it you have no desire ever to add another app to your life, that's no problem. We never want you to feel pressured in this process. The idea is to make things easier for people; not to add a burden to anyone's life.

Be watching. I'll be sending out complete information on how to create an account, and how to use it. I will also be adding a quick-link button for Vanco to our Facebook page and our website.

God's blessings as we move forward, spreading His Word and His love.

In the Word

And behold, a leper came to him and knelt down before him, saying, "Lord, if you will, you can make me clean." And Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him, saying, "I will; be clean." And immediately his leprosy was cleansed (Matthew 8:2–3).

Of the Word

Can you imagine what it would be like to not be touched? When you reached out your hand, no hand would reach back to touch yours. When you were overwhelmed or frightened, no arm would come around your shoulder to bring comfort. That was the lot of lepers in Jesus' day. They were ravaged by disease, labeled unclean, and faced a lonely life.






