Seventh in a Series on the history of RMGA written in preparation for the RMGA 20th Anniversary in 2013; originally published in April, 2013.

KUDOS!!!...BARBARA FOOS!!! RMGA is honored to have Barbara Foos serve as President of National Federation of Tourist Guide Associations [NFTGA] for this year. She describes it as a humbling experience although she has held many leadership positions over time. Barbara has been involved in the Molly Brown House Museum (MBHM) Advisory Council (Chair), the MBHM Volunteer Council (President), Denver Area PanHellenic Council (President) as well as with the Alpha Gamma Delta Alumni Chapter. When her children were young, she was active in Youth Club Sports as well.

Growing up near LaSalle, Colorado, Barbara saw her mother's involvement in many community activities. Her mother and other women in the area were contributing to their community institutions in many vital ways. These women were her inspiration and service was going to be a way of life also for her.

As a young woman, armed with a degree in Mathematics and a minor in Home Economics, she set off to see the world with her husband **Larry Foos**, who made a career in the United States Air Force During their 21 years in the military, Barbara participated in many and varied activities as an Officer's wife. She contributed, and she learned.

Returning home to Colorado when Larry retired from the Air Force, Barbara made a list of museums she was considering for volunteering. Her mother had served as a Governess on North Pennsylvania Street while she was attending CU School of Commerce. Barbara remembered her speaking of Margaret Brown as the stories about Margaret continued into the '40s along the Pennsylvania St. Corridor. So it made sense that Barbara's first choice for volunteer service would be at the Molly Brown House Museum. Like so many volunteers there, Barbara found Margaret Brown was an interesting and inspiring woman – and a kindred spirit. Katie, Barbara's granddaughter, is currently a page with her grandmother at the Molly Brown House Museum. Her great-grandmother would be proud.

Barbara relates that early RMGA member **Don Fox** recommended to her and others at the Museum to get involved in RMGA to better understand Tourism from another viewpoint. She liked what she found in RMGA—the organization and the members. She has served RMGA well: President for 6 years, Vice-President/Program Chair for 2 years, Director-at-Large for 4 years and Public Relations Chair for several years.

Her job as President of the NFTGA Board of Directors will continue the mission of bringing Association like ours from all over the country together to share in a way that all can network and to learn from each other. There are many commonalities amongst Associations, but each one is unique and has something important to share.

Barbara will continue what other Presidents and Boards have begun—to improve communications.

Historic Denver

Lake Steam Baths



Did you know that Denver's West Colfax neighborhood is home to one of the oldest Russian bathhouses in the United States? Lake Steam Baths at 3540 W. Colfax Avenue, founded by Harry and Ethel Hyman in 1927, is still owned and operated by members of the Hyman family. The Hymans immigrated to the United States from Russia in 1906. Originally known as the Lake Russian Baths, early advertisements touted the business as the "Most Modern Russian Bath House in the West." Just as today, men and women used the facilities on different days of the week. In late-2019 our Discover Denver volunteers documented the buildings of the West Colfax neighborhood, including the Lake Steam Baths.

Julia Greeley Home



If you look carefully behind the modern facade of the PlanOmatic building, located at 2911 Walnut Street, you can see hints of its past. The structure was once a boarding house and home to Denver's "Angel of Charity," Julia Greeley. After she was freed from slavery by Missouri's Emancipation Act of 1865, she began earning money by serving white families in Missouri, New Mexico, and Wyoming, but spent most of her time here in Denver. Greeley would later be called a "one-person St. Vincent de Paul Society", because she began assisting poor families in her neighborhood, giving away whatever she didn't need.

Greeley would conduct most of her charity work under the cover of darkness, to help avoid embarrassment for those she assisted. She helped provide food, fuel, and clothing, even begging for these items for others if her own resources weren't enough. Greeley was an enthusiastic member of the Catholic Church, joining Denver's Sacred Heart Parish in 1880, followed by the Secular Franciscan Order in 1901. Because she lived in a boarding house when she died in 1918, her body was laid out in her church, where hundreds of people turned out to pay their respects. Greeley was canonized in 2016 and her remains were transferred to Denver's Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in 2017

Aztlan Theatre



First called the Santa Theatre. Mission Revival-style house first movie opened its doors in 1927, during the silent film era. It cost \$150,000 to construct. could seat over 1,100 people, and included a full stage for vaudeville shows. Driving past the theatre today, it is easy to see that the facade has faded from its former glory days. Though the original marquee is gone, the original Santa Theatre signs remain,


one hanging vertically over the front entrance and the other displayed horizontally across the upper facade. The theatre served the La Alma Lincoln Park neighborhood, becoming a hub of entertainment for the Chicano community, showing movies until the 1970s. In 1972, the theatre was purchased by Tim Correa, an activist in the Denver Chicano Movement. Correa changed the name to Aztlan, which is the mythical homeland of the Aztecs and reclaimed ancestral home by Chicanos. The theatre was only one of three in Denver to regularly show Spanish-language Mexican films during the 1970s and early 80s. In 1987, the Aztlan began hosting musical events featuring rock and Mexican bands.




