In closing, I quote T.S. Eliot: "For last year's words belong to last year's language. And next year's words await another voice. And, to make an end is to make a beginning."





The speaker at this meeting was Sharon Wright, from the Office of Sustainability and Resiliency with the mayor's office.



In 1987, Congress declared March as National Women's History Month;




and, March 8 is specifically designated as International Women's Day. I'm sure


CONA update

CONA update

CONA welcomed Liz Abernathy, Planning & Zoning, and Dave Goodwin, Planning & Economic Development, to the May membership meeting to discuss the topics of corrugated metal fencing for residential properties and the city's noise ordinance, respectively.

Currently, the city code allows for corrugated metal fencing installations on commercial and industrial properties only. Some residents and City Council members are interesting in having this material approved for residential installa-

tions. Planning & Zoning is doing more research and gathering more data to determine whether or not corrugated metal fencing will be considered as an approved material for residential installations. This process will take several months to complete.

The city's current noise ordinance follows a Plainly Audible Stan-

dard which was adopted in 2008. Plainly Audible means "any sound that can be heard clearly by a person using his or her unaided hearing faculties." This is difficult to

enforce: From 2013 to 2017, only 99 citations were issued for about 16,400 noise complaints. The city is currently reviewing its noise ordinance and is considering re-adopting a decibel-based regulation that uses both dBA and dBC measurements.

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CONA update, August meeting

• Sharon Winters of Preservation and Planning presented "potential increases to residential density in coastal high hazard areas." There is a plan to increase density to coastal high hazard areas. Topics covered at the meeting were public safety vs. development, storm surge, sea level rise and how to mitigate risk, which they consulted with environmental

scientists, community leaders and emergency management. If changes are allowed, developers would have to address criteria to mitigate risk.

• Evan Mory, Director of Transportation and Parking Management, had a presentation on MLK Jr. Street's complete streets project and paving. The project would include resurfacing work from 4th to 34th avenues

north, add bike lanes from 4th to 30th avenues north and add five enhanced pedestrian crosswalks. In order to accommodate bike lanes, one of five motor vehicle lanes will be repurposed and the speed limit in this area will be reduced from 35 mph to 30 mph. Construction was projected to begin in September.



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

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
