
CLOSE TO EVERY DISCOVERY






THE COOL PALETTE



MELBOURNE CBD IS GROWING

Melbourne is the fastest growing city in Australia. CBD population growth is driven by a number of key factors:

- The growth in overseas migration, particularly skilled migrants and international students
- _ Easy access to:
 - The key employment centers
 - Great restaurants, bars, clubs, parks and gardens
 - Major Universities: RMIT,
 Melbourne University, Monash
 University and Victoria University
 - Great public transport

The growing preference of people to reside in a more central location during the 2000s, has been highlighted by the population growth in the Melbourne CBD, which has grown over the past 5 years at a rate of 13.9% per annum.

POPULATION GROWTH UNDERPINS RESIDENTIAL INVESTMENT

Melbourne's population is currently 4.0m, will be 5.0m by 2025 and is forecast to be at 7.0m by 2035.

The expected benefits of the minerals boom and an expanding household sector will steadily permeate through the economy, supporting a lift in employment and investment – particularly residential investment – and a significant and growing shortage in dwellings.³

LOW RATES DRIVING RENTAL DEMAND

Melbourne's vacancy rate is 2.4% and has been less than 3% since 2005. Rents are growing faster than inflation which is good news for investors.

With new apartment supply being well below the long term average and on track to remain at low levels in 2011/2012, vacancy rates will remain tight. As a result, investor confidence will improve in the short term as economic growth strengthens and borrowing restrictions ease, while persistently tight rental vacancies will apply upward pressure on rents.




SALES ACTIVITY IN APARTMENT MARKET STRONG


Melbourne's housing market showed positive growth of 7.1% over the 12 months to September 2011 to a total of 48,610 house sales, according to Residex. Melbourne was still the most active house market nationally, and still well ahead of the Sydney sales volume of 34,907.

Unit sales volume for Melbourne in the September 11 quarter showed a 7.7% increase, suggesting that the unit market in Melbourne has continued to attract reasonable levels of buyer enquiry in comparison to the house market.





MELBOURNE POPULATION GROWTH AND PROJECTIONS
