"For God is the one who gives seed to the farmer and bread to eat. In the same way, He will give you many opportunities to do good, and He will produce a great harvest of generosity in you. Yes, you will be enriched so that you can give even more generously. And when we take our gifts to those who need them, they will break out in thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9:10-11) (NLT)

Now listen to the Message translation ... "This most generous God who gives seed to the farmer that becomes bread for your meals is more than extravagant with you. He gives you something you can then give away, which grows into full formed lives, robust in God, wealthy in every way, so that you can be generous in every way, producing with us great praise to God." (2 Corinthians 9:10-11) (Message)

I hadn't really told anyone but earlier on in the year something in my heart said, "You'll be Santa Claus." At that point I decided to leave my beard grow. I know, it doesn't look like I ever cut it but I do. Anyways, I believe it was somewhere around October that Living Word Bible Church began planning for the promotion of the Angel Tree and Foster Care events for Christmas. It was in the middle of this meeting topic that I opened my mouth and blurted out, "If you need someone to be Santa for this event I've got a Santa outfit at home." By the looks on their faces and the laughter I don't believe they had even given Santa a thought ... yet. Well that did it. The very next day I received an email that they were taking me up on my offer.

At that point, I began mentally searching for that Santa outfit I said that I had. Instead of unpacking all of the tubs of Christmas lights and decorations in October, Michelle gave me the phone number where I could go rent a suit. However, when I arrived there they only had one or two out on the floor in October. By the time I went back, one month later, I'd decided that I wasn't going to rent one I was going to buy an even better one and keep it for the coming years. The day I brought it home and hung it in the closet I knew I had to come up with some sort of a story for Anthony. Let me explain.

Anthony is our 8 1/2 soon to be 9 year old grandson that has an amazing imagination and still 'believes' there is a Santa Claus. Why do you think it is that people want to burst the bubble of a child that still 'believes' in Santa Claus or the Easter Bunny for that matter? Whatever the reasoning I'm not going to do that to him. When he comes to me with that conclusion I'll still act completely shocked until 'he' convinces me otherwise. He'll arrive there but NOT this year. Listen how he helped me with this outreach at the church for Christmas. Like I said above I knew I needed a story of why I would be dressed as Santa Claus.

One day when I picked him up from school he said to me, "Grandpa, I know that all of these Santa Claus' at the malls and other places aren't the 'real' Santa. The 'real' Santa is at the North Pole making sure all the work gets done and the toys are ready for him to bring on Christmas Eve. All of these other guys are Santa's 'helpers'." Little did I know but my daughter Courtney had already been reinforcing this to him and that was my way in to my story.

I went home later that day and scribbled out a letter from 'The desk of Santa Claus' himself enlisting me for duty as his 'helper' here in Arizona. A few days later I called Anthony on the phone and read him the scribbled 'letter'. I said, "Guess what? I received a letter from Santa Claus asking me to be one of his helpers here in Arizona." He answered, "YOU ARE KIDDING ME!" I told him, "Nope, listen, I'll read you the letter. 'Dear Wade 'Duck' Anderson, I have been checking the Christmas lists from the children for this year and it seems to me that I need some more Santa's 'helpers' down there in Arizona. I know that you have a great HO! HO! HO!, a nice large beard, and I've also noticed that your belly has grown slightly. So, I would like for you to be one of my 'helpers' this year. I'll send you one of the Santa's 'helpers' suits soon. Thank you for helping ... Santa Claus." When I finished reading I could hear the joy and the 'I believe' in his voice as he said, "THAT'S COOL GRANDPA!"

I knew from this point it was a go. But wait! Now I had to produce the actual 'letter' for him to read for himself by the next time I seen him. Immediately, I got on the phone and called John and Courtney to let them know just what I needed. Overnight they got together and produced the letter on Santa stationary AND the envelope that it was to arrive in ... complete with an official Santa seal on the letter, a Santa stamp, post mark and Santa's address at the North Pole on the envelope. My daughter Courtney handed it off to me the very morning that I was to attend his 'Jingle Bell Jog' at the school. As him and I were walking across the school yard to the event I opened my jacket and pulled from the inside pocket, the 'very' letter that Santa had sent (wink, wink). Anthony looked up at me and said, "Wait, let me see that for a minute." As he examined every detail from top to bottom, like a rock from a sling shot his eyes were then fixed back to the address where Santa lived. That was when he said, "SO THAT'S HIS REAL ADDRESS! I'll have to borrow this from you later so I can write him directly."

Let me say right here that it was not the Living Word Bible Church that funded this particular outreach. They already had plenty of irons in the fire full of Christmas events. It was the people in the church that recognized the need and stepped up

large for the needs of others in the body. Let me also mention that this was an outreach totally separate from the Angel Tree and Foster Care events. That's what the body is suppose to do, right? We are to help meet the needs of the rest of the family. We see in *Acts 2:45* (International Standard Version), "They made it their practice to sell their possessions and goods and to distribute the proceeds to everyone, as anyone had need." When the body of Christ, the people in the church, step up to the plate and each give just a little and place it in God's hands He will always cause it to multiply to meet the need. People we have got to get a God attitude about giving and when we do, you will NEVER out give God! EVERYTHING we have belongs to God anyways so I encourage you all to Believe ... You ARE Blessed to be a Blessing. Listen here to the attitude that the early church had. In *Acts 4:32-34a* (NLT) we read, "All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything that they had. With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and much grace was upon them all. There were no needy persons among them."

I picked Anthony up from school early the day the we were scheduled for the evening outreach at the church. I already knew that he wanted to be my elf so Michelle had bought them both elf hats to wear that night. After I had colored my beard and made my cheeks and nose rosy red Anthony walked with me in to where I had my suit all laid out in preparation. As he stood and looked at my suit he looked up at me with his elf hat on and said, "Grandpa, I can't be your elf wearing an elf hat and kid's school cloths. I have to have an outfit too." So I yelled in to Michelle, "Come take this elf to get him his own outfit." They left, and in a flash they were back and everyone began to get into character. Anthony became 'Bob the Elf' and I, well you know who I was.

When I say that we got in to character I mean to tell you 'Bob' was amazing! I'm proud of all my grandsons already but that night 'Bob' made me even more proud of him. 'Bob' interacted with the kids in his own way by using his imagination which 100% helped keep their dreams alive. While I was in my spot giving gifts, helping them unwrap gifts, answering their questions and taking pictures, 'Bob' was filling sandwich bags with cookies and candy canes for them to take home with them.

Out of the blue one little boy came over to me and asked, "does 'Bob' really make all of the Lego's at the North Pole?" I answered quickly, "Well, yes he does. 'Bob' is in charge of the whole Lego department," but thought to myself, "Way to go 'Bob'." 'Bob' helped me hand out arms full of gifts to all the kids and nearly every cookie and candy cane we had. We didn't sit down and strategize this whole event out with each other. Everything that 'Bob' did came from his imagination, the way that he seen it in his very own heart the way elves operated.

The thing that made me the most proud of 'Bob' was the fact that he got it! His mom, dad and us as grandparents have done our best with these little ones to teach them that it is always better to give than receive, and we can NEVER out give God. Not once did 'Bob' give reluctantly or get angry because not one of those gifts were for him. Second Corinthians 9:6-8 (NIV) is exactly the attitude that I watched my littlest grandson, I mean 'Bob the Elf', display. "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in ALL things at ALL times, having ALL that you need, you WILL abound in every good work." And 2 Corinthians 9:9 (NLT) says, "Godly people give generously to the poor. Their good deeds will never be forgotten." Giving is not usually a money issue, it's a HEART issue.

Evidently God is not done using me here where I am at so for that reason I'm okay. While I have been here God has shown and taught me so much. I feel I am ready to come home and I have the help there on the streets waiting for me. I know the blessing of my freedom will come soon. I have gained so much that I wouldn't have gotten anywhere else by being here on this yard. In the midst of it all I am grateful. Praise God!!

In one of your cards you mentioned that our pastors there at Living Word Bible Church had taught on 'The Body of Christ'. That caught my eye because I also did a similar study. I would like to share with the rest of the Owncomers for Official family some of these Scriptures.

"Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We ARE ALL parts of His one body, and each of us has different work to do. And since we ARE ALL one body in Christ, we belong to each other, and each of us needs the others." (Romans 12:4-5)

"No one hates his own body but lovingly cares for it, just as Christ cares for His body, which is the church. And WE ARE His body." (Ephesians 5:29-30)

"As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be humble and gentle. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of ALL, Who is over ALL and through ALL and IN ALL." (Ephesians 4:1-6)

"You can easily enough see how this kind of thing works than looking no further than your own body. Your body has many parts - limbs, organs, cells - but no matter how many parts you can name, you're still one body. It's exactly the same with Christ. By means of His one Spirit, we ALL said good-bye to our partial and piecemeal lives. We each used to independently call our own shots, but then we entered into a large and integrated life in which He has the final say in everything. Each of us is now a part of His resurrection body, refreshed and sustained at one fountain - His Spirit - where we ALL come to drink." (2 Corinthians 12:12-16 Message)

I hope and pray that you all can feel the same Spirit that I did when I put this together. We ALL, those who have believed and received Jesus into our lives, whether we are locked up or on the streets, are a part of the body of Christ. We ALL have a certain responsibility as parts of His family and body. Listen here to the way the Message (Paraphrase) Translation shares 1 Peter 2:13-17, "Friends, this world is not your home, so don't make yourselves cozy in it. Don't indulge your ego at the expense of your soul. Live an exemplary life among the natives so that your actions will refute their prejudices. Then they'll be won over to God's side and be there to join in the celebration when He arrives. Make the Master proud of you by being good citizens. Respect the authorities, whatever their level; they are God's emissaries for keeping order. It is God's will that by doing good, you might cure the ignorance of the fools who think you're a danger to society. Exercise your freedom by serving God, not by breaking the rules. Treat everyone you meet with dignity. LOVE YOUR SPIRITUAL FAMILY. Revere God. Respect the government." I thank God for helping me to get away from that old life and in to a new and improved one, into God's family, the body of Christ. Since I've come to this yard I've also learned to crochet and have been able to participate in making as much as possible for the Children's Crisis Center. I've also been thinking about making some friendship bracelets with tags attached to them that say, "You have more than a friend in God - God loves you."

I'll close with these words from the Apostle Paul in Romans 12:1-2 (NLT), "And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice - the kind He will accept. when you think of what He has done for you, is this too much to ask? Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way that you think. Then you will know what God



wants you to do, and you will know how good and pleasing and perfect His will really is."

Life is All About Love By G.B.B.

Let me open up with these two foundational scriptures: "No matter what I say, what I believe and what I do, I am bankrupt without love." (1 Corinthians 13:36 Message) "Love means living the way God commanded us to live. As you have heard from the beginning, His command is this, Live a life of Love." (2 John 1:6 NCV)

Brothers and Sisters, life is all about love. Because God is love (1 John 4:8, 16) the most important lesson He wants us to learn on earth is how to love. It is in loving that we are most like Him, so love is the foundational command He has given us. Jesus told us in John 13:34-35, "A new command I give to you; love one another." Learning to love unself-ishly is not an easy task, in fact it runs counter to our self-centered nature. This is why we are given a lifetime to learn it. Of course, God wants us to love others in His family, other brothers and sisters in the Lord. And as we've already seen, this is the second most important purpose for our new lives. Peter tells us in 1 Peter 2:17 (ISV), "Honor everyone, keep on loving the community of believers." And the Apostle Paul echoes the same message in Galatians 6:10 (NIV), "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

Why does God insist that we give special love and attention to other believers? Why do they get what seems to be priority in loving? Because God wants His family to be known for its love more than anything else. Jesus told us above, in **John 13:35** (my paraphrase) that it's our love for one another, not our doctrinal beliefs that will be our greatest witness to the world. In heaven, we will enjoy God's Family forever, but first we've got some tough work to do here on earth to prepare ourselves for an eternity of loving. God trains us by giving us family responsibilities and the foremost of this is to practice loving each other, right here in the now. God wants us to be in regular close fellowship with other believers so that we can develop the skill of loving. Love cannot be learned in isolation, we have to be around irritating, imperfect and frustrating people just like ourselves. It's through fellowship that we learn this important truth.

The best use of life is Love. Love is not a good part of our life, Love is the Most Important part. Paul encourages us in 1 Corinthians 14:1 (Message), "Go after a life of Love as if your life depended on it - because it does." It's not enough to say that one of the things I want in life is to be loving as if loving is on our Top 10 things to achieve list. Relationships must have priority in life, above everything else. Why? Life without love is worthless! Paul makes this point very evident in 1 Corinthians 13:1 (NLT), "If I could speak in any language in heaven or on earth, but didn't love others, I would only be making meaningless noise like a loud gong or a clanging cymbal." In the Message Bible, it reads "I'm nothing but the creaking of a rusty gate". Often we act as if relationships are something to be squeezed into our schedules. We talk about finding time for our children or making time for people in our lives that gives us the impression that relationships are thought of as or like many of our other tasks. But God says that relationships are what life is all about. Four of the ten commandments deal with our relationships with God, while the remaining six of them deal with our relationships with our people. So, all ten of them deal with relationships. Fact, Jesus was asked by the scribes in Mark 12:28 (NLT) "Of all the commandments, which is the most important? Jesus' reply was 'The most important commandment is this, Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is the one and only Lord and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength. The second is equally important, Love your neighbor as yourself, no other commandment is greater than these." (Mark 12:29-31).

So, we all can see right here from the lips of Jesus, learning to love God is our first priority and our second priority should be learning to love others, Love will last forever. Another reason God tells us to make love our top priority is that love is eternal. In 1 Corinthians 13:1-7, Paul is sharing with us, all of the things love is supposed to look like in our lives. I encourage you all to read those verses for yourselves. After Paul's explanation of God's kind of love, he goes directly into 1 Corinthians 13:8 and tells us, "Love will last forever." Now drop down a few verses to 1 Corinthians 13:13 and listen closely, "So these three thing continue forever; faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is love." Love leaves a legacy. How we treated other people, not our wealth or accomplishments is the most enduring impact any of us can leave on this earth. Mother Theresa said, "It's not what you do, but how much love you put into it that matters." Love is the secret of a lasting heritage.

Foot's Bible Study Rotes

1 Chronicles 26:12-29:30

War plunder rightfully belonged to the victorious army. These soldiers, however, gave their portion of all the plunder to the house of the Lord to express their dedication to God. Like these commanders, we should think of what we can give, rather than what we are obligated to give. Is your giving a matter of rejoicing rather than duty? Give as a response of joy and love for God. (26:27)

The kingdom of Israel belonged to the Lord, not to David or anyone else. Israel's king, then, was God's deputy, commissioned to carry out God's will for the nation. Thus, God could choose the person He wanted as king without following customary lines of succession. David was not Saul's heir, and Solomon was not David's oldest son, but this did not matter because God appointed them. (28:5)

David gave from his personal fortune to the temple. He encouraged others to follow his example, and they willingly did. Both the tabernacle (*Exodus 35:5-36:7*) and the temple were built from voluntary gifts of the people like David. We can acknowledge that all we have comes from God. (29:14-16) We may not have David's wealth, but we can develop his willingness to give. It is not what we have that counts with God, but our willingness to give it. (29:3-5)

Romans 4:13-5:21

When we accept Jesus Christ as our Savior, an exchange takes place. We give Him our sins, and He forgives us and makes us right with God (2 Corinthians 5:21). There is nothing we can do to earn this. Only through Christ can we be made right in God's eyes. What an incredible bargain this is for us! But sadly many still choose to pass up this gift to continue 'enjoying' their sin. (4:25)

Paul states that, as believers, we now stand in a place of high privilege. Not only has God declared us not guilty, He has drawn us close to Himself. Instead of being enemies we have become His friends in fact, His own children. (John 15:15; Galatians 4:5) (5:2)

"While we were still sinners," these are amazing words, God sent Jesus Christ to die for us, not because we were good enough, but just because He loved us. Whenever you feel uncertain about God's love for you. Remember that He loved you even before you turned to Him. (5:8)

Psalm 14:1-15:5

The true atheist is either foolish or wicked - foolish because he ignores evidence that God exists or wicked because he refuses to live by God's truths. We become atheists by practice when we rely more on ourselves than on God. The fool mentioned here is someone who is aggressively perverse in his actions. To speak in direct defiance of God is utterly foolish according to the Bible. (14:1-3)

Some people are so obsessed with money that they will change their God-given standards and lifestyle to get it. If money is a controlling force in your life, it must be curbed, or it will harm others and destroy your relationship with God. (15:5)

Proverbs 19:17-19

Here God indentifies with the poor as Jesus does in *Matthew 25:31-46*. Our Creator, God, values all of us whether we are poor or rich. When we help the poor, we honor both the Creator, and His creation. God accepts our help as if we directly offered it to Him. (19:17)

Refusing to discipline your children will doom the child's future. Look also at Proverbs 13:24. (19:18)

My nephew led me to Christ when I was on the street and then I went back to prison on a violation to Florence West. While I was there I went to church and was even baptized. At that time I prayed this prayer, "Father God I'm a mess. I need Your help. Please clean me up and help me to remove all of the filthiness and evil in me. Come into the rooms of my heart and sweep them clean and replace it all with You and Your goodness."

When I got released I thought I was fixed, but I was wrong. I went right back to drugs and it was like I got even worse. My family had left and moved to Montana before I was released so I was on my own when I got out. My girlfriend and I moved into my mom's property because it was about to be foreclosed on due to being five mortgage payments behind. So, I did crime and got the payments caught up, it seemed, but two days later it was due again. There wasn't any water or electricity there so I was cooking some eggs on a barbeque grill. It was stormy and windy so I moved the grill where the wind wasn't as bad. I had the grill about 5 feet from the wall. All I had was wood 2x4's, so I added a little gas then lit it, cooked my eggs and closed the vents in the grill top and let it burn out. After eating I went inside and went to sleep. I don't know how long it was but I woke up choking on smoke. At first I thought it was a candle but it wasn't. I searched the house looking for the source and found it burning near the laundry room and realized it was from the grill. I ran outside to move the grill and seen that the wall was black with a halo of orange above it. I touched it and it was hot so I quickly thought, "I'll call the fire department."

Instead, I went right in to panic mode and ran to the neighbor's house to use their garden hose and hooked it to mine. That wasn't good enough so I started trying to pull the siding off to get to it. While I was spraying it, I realized it was not working so I screamed to the neighbor to call the fire department. As soon as I looked back at the house I thought I seen a light on but knew I didn't have any electricity. I kicked a hole in the lower part of the wall and shoved the hose inside. As I opened the door and ran inside I seen the room was full of flames everywhere. Grabbing the hose I still tried to put it out but seen it was no use.

So what do you think the next thing on my mind was? I had to hurry and run to my room to get my 'crime bag'. I grabbed the bag and ran outside to hide it knowing the fire department and cops would be there soon. Then I ran back inside to get my clothes. I ran back outside and put them in a block shed next to the house thinking they would be safe. I attempted to go in a third time but came out on my knees coughing from all the smoke. At that point I grabbed my phone and took a picture and posted it on my Facebook page with the caption, "Mom this is your house, I'm sorry." Then the fire department and the sheriff showed up. EVERY-THING burned up, all of my mom's stuff, all of my past away dad's legacy and what little stuff I had. In the matter of a few short hours, I lost everything. I was now homeless and penniless.

I was so distraught that I went even deeper in to sorrow and drug addiction. That's when my girlfriend broke up with me because I know she didn't like seeing me destroy myself. I was now on the streets back and forth between Tempe and Phoenix being a bum. I used a credit card and eventually had warrants out for my arrest so I couldn't even shoplift or go to a shelter. For the next 5 months, I felt like I was starving while only eating ornamental fruit from the trees along the streets. Before long I was hearing voices and to this day I believe they were demons.

Through all of this, I felt God strip away my hate, my pride and my prejudice. He stripped me down mind, body and soul! I was broken. I finally said, "God I can't do this. All I'm doing is making things worse with the crime and desperate acts. I don't want to be tormented anymore. Please have mercy on me, but please don't put me away for another 10 years, have mercy on me." After this I went back to Casa Grande to say good bye to a few people that had helped me. When I was done there I was going to turn myself in and face the 14 class 4 felony forgeries I had stacked up. I knew I could be facing at least 20 years. But by the grace and mercy of God I only received 3 years total.

I'll fast forward ... I went to prison for those 3 years and was page 2'd five months later and received what I thought would be another 5 years. This again was for identity theft and knew it could have been at least another 10 years. Again I received grace and mercy by my Savior! Glory to God!! I could have been looking at the rest of my life behind bars but instead I received 4 years and 5 months TOTAL!

God is GOOD, merciful and loving but He wasn't done yet. From there He put me on a yard with many other Christians and great worship services. After that He moved me to a minimum yard, and not just a minimum yard but one considered to be a 'camp' with no politics. I now realize it is all a blessing from God and I know He is not going to undo the work He has started in me. For four years now, I have been walking with Jesus. Every morning with prayer and thanksgiving I do an early Bible study and church fellowship.

Now I'm getting close to my release and have been trying to make plans for two years to where I would go. With everyone gone from my life I know I am on my own so I have been writing different churches and half way houses looking for some kind of help. I know I'll make it because I now have Jesus and I'm NOT the same man I used to be. I also wrote to you asking you for friendship and mentorship, But I really didn't have any plans to go to your church because I don't know anything or anyone in Mesa. No other churches even contacted me, only you. At that point I went to God in prayer this time not making my own plans but asking His direction for my release. Shortly after this I was lead to a halfway house in Mesa so I asked around and found that your church is not far from there. The train service is in the same area and the job I have lined up is only 7 miles from there and on the train route. Even though I don't know anyone there in Mesa I now know I can get around pretty easily and I'm excited and anxious for my release.

Even though I don't know all of what God has in store for me I know He loves me and has only plans to prosper me and not to harm me. God has only ever showed me love in everything He has done even when He is correcting me. I will NOT return to the same old vomit! Thanks for inviting me to fellowship with you all there at the Overcomers for Official and the Living Word Bible Church. - D. H.
