- 2. CenCON Business
 - A. President's Report, C.J.Whelan
 - CenCON will not be able to meet in the Library Admin. building after 1 Jan. due to scheduled construction. For the first quarter of the year, we'll schedule the meetings around the City.
 - There followed a brief discussion about possibly having a way to share our members' contact information. The Executive Board will look into this.

 - There being no corrections, a motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to accept the Sept. 2023 minutes as emailed. (Cummins/Hamilton)
 - C. Treasurer, Jill Meakins
 - CenCON has \$2,177.99 in our accounts.

 - D. VP of Membership, Andrew Spaulding: No report
 - E. VP of Plans, Rhonda Livingston
- 3. Centennial Government and Special Districts (We ask our guests to limit their comments to 7 minutes.)
 - A. 18th Judicial District, Aurora Ogg. This was addressed in the first hour of the meeting.
 - B. South Metro Fire Rescue, Jens Dietryk
 - The South Metro Board has taken a position opposing Proposition HH.
 - Jens distributed a sheet of SMFR Jan.-June 30 calls.
 - There've been ~5,000 911 SMFR responses, a 10% increase every year but,
 the majority are EMS calls. Actual fires went down.

- October was Fire Prevention Month. A majority of the fires are kitchen fires. The slogan for Oct. Was: Cooking Safety Starts with You
- SMFR has deployed 71 staff to 21 forest fires.
- SMFR has 2-3 cardiac arrests per day; 46% of the time callers got a heartbeat over the phone. (Dispatch starts compressions over the phone)
- Hamilton asked why are calls increasing every year? Response: Today there's more traffic, more seniors, people.
- Rosser: On the heat map, there are some hot spots? Others in the room said Southglenn and Jens added senior facilities.

 - This year's event will host local youth choirs, Santa, free cookies and cocoa and family-friendly activities.
 - The *Homeless Outreach Liaison* continues to conduct outreach to unhoused individuals & families in Centennial. In addition, Ms. *Veronica Gates* participates in numerous meetings with organizations providing homelessness resources and services, including the *Faith Council, Change the Trend, and Homeless Committees* in several jurisdictions. Ms. Gates has also been conducting outreach with the business community, visiting multiple establishments near her interactions with the unhoused, as well as several hotels & apartment buildings. She continues strengthening partnerships with other organizations providing homeless outreach, allowing her to venture into hot spots like the Highline Canal and the field behind IKEA without having to worry as much about safety concerns. CenCON will have her speak with us as soon as we can sync our schedules.

- encounter Church contacted Ms. Gates about a family of five that was staying at Motel 6 on Arapahoe Rd. She was able to secure funding from Catholic Charities to get the family a flight back to Virginia, enabling them to reunite with family members who were willing to take them in.
- The Dept. of Local Affairs (DOLA) has formally accepted Centennial's application to opt-in to Proposition 123. The application includes a goal to increase the number of affordable housing units through *new construction or conversation of 108* affordable housing units by Dec. 31, 2026. DOLA's acceptance means Centennial & private organizations operating in the City are eligible to apply for a range of grant programs operated by DOLA and Colorado Housing & Finance Authority (CHFA). Staff will continue to monitor these grant programs and will bring opportunities to Council and the City's partners as appropriate.
- The City has *completed the implementation of all energy conservation up- grades* at the Civic Center & the Public Works building, which included interior and exterior lighting upgrades, window film installation, rooftop HVAC unit replacements, and a new energy management system.
 - From Q1 through Q3 2023, the energy performance contract electric savings were an estimated *284,415 kilowatt hours and 3,880 therms of natural gas, and \$26,420 of utility savings*. (In 2022, the verified electric savings were 353,424 kilowatt hours and 5,184 therms of natural gas savings, and \$24,561 of utility savings.)
 - The City's contractor completed installation of rooftop solar panels at the Civic Center and is finishing the construction of the solar canopy structures in the Civic Center parking lot.

Orchard Road Widening

- Estimated completion: Spring 2024
- Budget: \$1,996,202 (construction contract)
- Project description: A design project on Orchard Rd between Ogden Ct & the High Line Canal is underway. This project intends to install a westbound, left turn lane into Franklin St, and also install curb, gutter, sidewalk, and an underground storm line within the identified stretch.

Arapahoe Rd & Clarkson Traffic Signal

- Design is complete
- Estimated completion is 2024 TBD
- Budget: \$123,000 (design); \$500,000 (construction estimate, \$400,000. DRCOG Safer Main Streets grant, \$100,000 City match)
- Holly Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon System Crossing (south of Easter)
 - Estimated completion is 2024 TBD
- Alton Way Sidewalk and Street Lighting
 - Estimated completion is 2024 spring

Arapahoe Rd. Bridge over Big Dry Creek Reconstruction

- Through Oct, crews will continue to build the roadway over Big Dry Creek. Crews are completing finishing activities for the bridge, including stone and wall aesthetic work. Under the bridge, crews continue stream stabilization efforts & will install new waterline infrastructure. In addition to the work above, crews will prepare and pave the North Trail through the construction zone.
- Traffic continues to travel in new lane configurations. To support final roadway construction and paving, rolling lane closures are anticipated. Tentatively starting Oct. 18, traffic will be restricted to one lane in each direction, and the phase

is anticipated to last 2 weeks. Closures at Elizabeth are also anticipated for an undetermined duration. Detour routes on University Blvd and Dry Creek Rd are highly encouraged.
