Ordinance O-2016-15

**AN ORDINANCE STATING SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED TO THE
PROPOSED ANNEXED TERRITORY**

WHEREAS, a Petition seeking the annexation of approximately 0.1963 acres of land situate in Batavia Township to the Village of Amelia was filed with the Clermont County Board of County Commissioners by Todd Hart, Agent for Petitioners, on March 14, 2016; and,

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 709.03(D) requires the legislative authority of the municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed shall adopt an ordinance or resolution stating what services the municipal corporation will provide, and an approximate date by which it will provide them, to the territory proposed for annexation, upon annexation;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, a majority of its members concurring.

SECTION I. The Council of Amelia Village states that immediately upon annexation the following services will be provided to the territory to be annexed:

1. Police Protection;
2. Fire Protection;
3. Zoning and Planning Administration;
4. Waste Management;
5. Maintenance of Public Streets.

The Village may, in its sole discretion, provide additional services to the territory, upon annexation, in addition to those set forth above.

SECTION II. No street or highway will be divided or segmented by the boundary line between the Township and the Village so as to create a road maintenance problem, but should the annexation result in a street or highway being divided or segmented by the boundary line between the Township and the Village so as to create a road maintenance problem, Amelia Village hereby agrees, as a condition of the annexation, to assume the maintenance of that street or highway.

SECTION III. Village Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
