

Incense on September 24th


Incense will be used for church on 9/24. It will be light but we remind people with sensitivities to please plan their seating accordingly.

Wednesday and Sunday Study



We are coming up on the first anniversary of the signing of our Parish Link Agreement with the district of Fort Dauphin. This district, along with Amboasary (St. James the Less' Parish Link), are overseen by Venerable Canon Donne. We are planning a celebration on Sunday, October 22. We will have a special coffee hour with Loaka and a special Malagasy cake. Loaka is one of the mainstays of the Malagasy diet. It is made up of meat of whatever kind available (we will use ground beef) and various veggies all served over rice. We

had this as lunch during one of our Madagascar Wednesday Book Studies and everyone really liked it. So be sure to be in church on October 22 and stay for coffee hour.

Have you now checked the kids wall to see the updated pictures? Several months ago, all us sponsors received the updated pictures and letters from our kids. I still smile when I remember the salutation from my Ronia ("What's up Mama Miriam?")!!!! If you haven't checked them out, please do so.

Next week is the week for the kids attending Tsiharoa Primary School, a government school, to receive their school supplies from us. The teachers will also receive either the money we earmarked for them or their supplies, I don't know which at this time. Either way, you all have helped this school tremendously.

Large numbers of baptisms continue to be happening throughout the Diocese of Toliara and new churches are rising up. What a wonderful testament to what God can do in the poorest of places and with unexpected people. Remember, Venerable Canon Donne was the town drunk when Bishop Todd McGregor first met him and he had a third grade education. Now he goes on vacation and founds a new church of 90 members!!!!! Truly, all things are possible....


