


From the Desk of Roundtable President Charles Holt

"To win a world war, the Allies needed men and matériel transported around the globe. The US Merchant Marine undertook this challenge, serving as a vital link between America's Arsenal of Democracy and the fighting fronts. Frequently protected by naval and Coast Guard escorts, civilian merchant mariners and sailors of the US Naval Armed Guard risked their lives to deliver the goods. Eighty Years ago! . . . on November 16, 1942 . . .

- Operation TORCH ended in Allied victory
- The Kokoda Track campaign ended in Allied victory
- The Naval Battle of Casablanca Nov 8-16 ended in American victory (See also links: https://www.thoughtco.com/naval-battle-of-casablanca-2360516 and https://www.history.navy.mil/content/history/museums/nmusn/explore/photography/wwii/wwii-north-africa-campaign/naval-battle-of-casablanca.html)
- German Submarine U-173 was depth charged and sunk off Casablanca by American warships
- November 27: Scuttling of the French fleet in Toulon: This was intended to keep the fleet out of the hands of German forces. 3 battleships, 7 cruisers, 15 destroyers, 12 submarines and 13 torpedo boats were among the ships scuttled. - November 28: The Cocoanut Grove nightclub fire killed 492 people in Boston.
- November 30: The Battle of Tassafaronga was fought off Tassafaronga Point, Guadalcanal



- Eighty-one years ago! on December 7, 1941, Japan staged a surprise attack on Pearl Harbor, decimating the US Pacific Fleet.
- ♦ When Germany and Italy declared war on the United States days later, America found itself in a global war. Propaganda poster developed by the Office of War Information following the attack on Pearl Harbor. . . . A year later, On December 12, 1942 (Saturday) **The Germans began Operation Winter Storm**, an attempt to break the Soviet encirclement of the 6th Army at Stalingrad. The Soviets began a winter offensive codenamed Operation Little Saturn.
