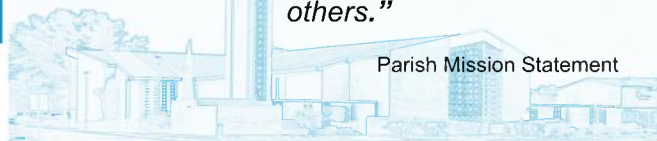

Baptisms—Baptismal arrangements must be made by the PARENTS of the child at the Parish Office. Parents and godparents *must* attend a baptismal preparation class before the baptism. Other requirements will be discussed at the initial interview.

Matrimony—Weddings are celebrated throughout the year. In accord with Church Law, at least one of the parties to be married must be a member of St. Joseph, otherwise special permissions are needed. Marriage preparation is to begin at least 6 months prior to the wedding. It is strongly recommended that a couple planning to be married at St. Joseph contact the Parish before making any contractual arrangements with a facility for their reception. During the initial interview with the priest of the Parish, the couple will be provided with all the necessary information needed for their preparation experience.

TIMES OF REFRESHING

SOUND LITURGICAL DISCIPLINE – Recently, much talk has been made about what makes for “sound” liturgy and in conformity to the rubrics of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. I would like to begin with personal disciplines that we may want to practice at St. Joseph’s before we continue on with more little changes that we have to make.

- **Come on time!** – It is simply good manners to come on time to mass. After all, the main “host” is the Lord Himself. The least that we can do is be present when mass begins.
- **Please dress appropriately!** – When accepting a “dinner invitation”, we dress appropriately, right? Well, we need to be properly attired when coming to mass. I have noted that some people come dressed like they are going to the beach. Can we cover up so that we don’t distract others?
- **Sit in the main nave** – I have always teased people about sitting in the same pew for the last “hundred years”. However, there are times when the center nave is empty and it looks funny that at consecration, I lift the chalice up to rows of empty pews. Please consider moving to the center nave.
- **Sit up front** – Another “funny” trait that we Catholics have is that we tend to sit in the very last pew. One comment I heard was that if I installed pews in the parking lot, it would be the first one filled. Please come and sit up front so that you would have better participation at the liturgy of the Mass.
- **No texting, reading the bulletin and carrying out conversations.** - From where I am, I could very well spot all these “extra” activities. I am sure that these can wait.
- **ABSOLUTELY, no GUM!** A few times, I have had to ask people to remove gum from their mouths before I give them Holy Communion. Just think! Would you like Jesus to be wrestling with the gum in your mouth? You would also be surprised as to how much gum we find stuck underneath the pews!
- **Coming with “fussy” children?** Take them outside to calm them down before returning. Yes, we closed the “cry room” for a variety of reasons. The main one was that there is no responsible adult who oversees it and we want to avoid having “questionable” activities going on. Besides, we need to train our children to behave properly at mass.
- **PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR TRASH!** - We have found a variety of trash left in the pews – candy wrappers, bottles of water, soda, etc., dirty diapers, soiled tissues, etc. I am sure that you wouldn’t want your guests to leave their trash in your house when you entertain.
- **DO NOT LEAVE BEFORE THE DISMISSAL!** It amazes me how some people receive communion and head straight for the door. Simply put, the mass isn’t done yet! Can you not wait another 5 minutes? Just remember, the Lord is watching that door, too!

Please don’t be offended by this list. I am trying to reach out to a minority who are guilty; however, they may simply be aware of it. Take this in good humor and a positive criticism.

DISCIPLINA LITÚRGICA SOLIDA - Recientemente, se ha hablado mucho de lo que hace que la liturgia este "bien cimentada" y en conformidad con las rubricas de la Instrucción General del Misal Romano. Me gustaría comenzar con las disciplinas personales que quizás queremos practicar en San José antes de continuar con otros cambios más pequeños que tenemos que hacer.

- **¡Llegar a tiempo!** - Es simplemente buenos modales llegar a tiempo a misa. Después de todo, el principal "anfitrión" es el Señor mismo. Lo menos que podemos hacer es estar presente cuando comienza la misa.
- **Por favor, vístense adecuadamente!** - Cuando aceptamos una "invitación a cenar", nos vestimos apropiadamente, ¿verdad? Bueno, tenemos que estar bien vestidos cuando vengamos a misa. He notado que algunas personas vienen vestidas como si fueran a la playa. ¿Podríamos vestirnos adecuadamente para no distraer a los demás? .
- **Siéntense en la nave principal** - siempre he molestado con bromas a la gente por estar sentados en el mismo banco durante los últimos "cien años". Sin embargo, hay veces cuando la nave central está vacía y parece gracioso que en la consagración, levanto el cáliz hacia filas de bancos vacíos. Por favor considere cambiarse a la nave central.
- **Siéntense enfrente, cerca del altar** – Otra tendencia "curiosa" que tenemos los Católicos es que nos gusta sentarnos en las últimas bancas. Uno de los comentarios que escuché es que si instalamos bancas en el area del estacionamiento, serían las primeras en llenarse. Por favor, vengan y siéntense enfrente, cerca del altar, de esa manera podrá tener una mejor participación en la Liturgia de la Misa.
- **No "Textee, no se ponga a leer el boletín y no platique durante la misa.** Desde donde yo estoy puedo darme cuenta de todas esas actividades extras. Estoy seguro que esas cosas pueden esperar.
- **Por Favor, NO MASTIQUE CHICLE.** Algunas veces he tenido que pedir a la gente que remueva el chicle de su boca antes de darle la Sagrada Comunión. Piensen, les gustaría que Jesús tuviera que luchar con su chicle en su boca? Se sorprenderían si supieran que tanto chicle encontramos pegado debajo de las bancas!
- **¿Vienen con niños "inquietos"?** Llévenlos afuera para calmarlos antes de regresar. Sí, cerramos el "cuarto para niños" por una variedad de razones. La principal fue que no hubo un adulto responsable que lo supervisara y queremos evitar actividades "que puedan cuestionarse". Además, tenemos que entrenar a nuestros hijos a comportarse correctamente durante la misa.
- **POR FAVOR NO DEJE BASURA!** - Hemos encontrado una gran cantidad de basura dejada en los bancos - envolturas de caramelos, botellas de agua, refrescos, etc., pañales sucios, tejidos sucios, etc. Estoy seguro de que no le gustaría que sus invitados dejaran basura en su casa.
- **NO SE SALGA ANTES DE LA BENDICIÓN!** Me sorprende cómo algunas personas reciben la comunión y se encaminan derechito hacia la puerta. En pocas palabras, la misa no se ha terminado toda vía! ¿No pueden esperarse otros 5 minutos? Sólo recuerde, que el Señor también está mirando esa puerta!

Por favor, no se ofendan por esta lista. Estoy tratando de llegar a una minoría que es culpable; sin embargo, pueden simplemente ser conscientes de ello. Tome esto con buen humor y como una crítica positiva.

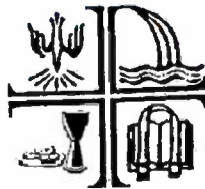
