So much of my life has revolved around singing ... good times singing in church (The Gospelaires!) and a lot of fun singing in high school groups. Somewhere around 1994 I started singing with a bluegrass group called Lights of Home. That group brought me about 16 years of making memories making music at venues all over the Ozarks. There was also another bluegrass group that I sang in with Ma&Pa called Country Harmony.

Well...Well...Well ...all these memories and all those years flying by in a few paragraphs. The show must go on and I am happy to report that I am still singing. I still get to sing a bit with Ma&Pa. I still sing bluegrass in a band called Blue Train. I sing duets with my friend, Kenny Key, in what we call our favorite songwriters tour. We sing some of our favorite songs in folk/country/pop and some original songs from my favorite songwriter ... Kenny Key.
