REST & RENEWAL

² Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. Romans 12:2

³⁰Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; ³¹but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up

with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint. Isaiah 40:30-31

As summer winds down and families return from their getaways, many of us carry memories of rest and renewal. Perhaps you remember childhood summers at the beach, or maybe you're like my grandparents who found their deepest rest in the quieter fall months. They often said the beach was much more peaceful without the summer crowds—a reminder that sometimes the most restorative times come not when it's convenient, but when we intentionally create space for renewal.

Each October, pastors from across South Carolina gather at Lutheridge for just such a time of spiritual recharging. There are inspiring lectures, apple picking, and afternoons spent on porches with fellow ministers. Yet sometimes—if I'm being honest—I return from these retreats feeling like I need another retreat to process all the deep thoughts provoked! Have you ever felt that way after a vacation? Like you need time to rest from your time of rest?

This reminds me of Jesus' experience in Matthew 4, when the Spirit led Him into the wilderness for forty days of fasting and testing. It was after this time of spiritual discipline—when He was physically and emotionally depleted—that the tempter approached with his strongest temptations. This teaches us something crucial: we all need genuine rest and renewal, because it's when we're tired and weary that we become most vulnerable to discouragement and temptation.

In our world today, with news of violence and senseless acts filling the news, it's easy to feel overwhelmed by the presence of evil. These tragic events remind us that we live in a world where darkness and light coexist, and sometimes the darkness feels too heavy to bear.

But here's my message of pure hope for you today: **Jesus is good!** He is infinitely bigger than any evil we might encounter. He has witnessed every form of suffering and darkness this world can produce, yet He remains unshaken in His goodness. He walks the same paths we walk, sees what we see, and understands our struggles.

Remember this eternal truth: evil and darkness can only be conquered by goodness and light. Jesus is that Light! And incredibly, He has entrusted us—His church—to carry that light into every corner of our world. We are His vessels, chosen to spread brightness into the deepest, darkest places where hope seems lost.

So take heart, dear congregation. Rest when you need to rest. Allow yourself to be renewed by His presence. But then rise up with wings like eagles, strengthened by your time with the Lord, and go forth carrying your brightest light into a world that desperately longs to see the Light of Christ. In a time when darkness seems prevalent, we have the incredible privilege of being light-bearers. What a calling! What a hope! What a Savior we serve! May you find true rest in Him, and may His light shine brightly through you wherever you go.




