There is the other half which is costs, what do they do for exposure to illness and other cluster sicknesses, and is there a waiting list. In this day and age with a pandemic, daycare facilities have to be precautious. Children can be susceptible to diseases, which is why having policies, rules and regulations in place is beneficial. For example, child care settings must now limit the number of children they have in their care at once. In order to reduce the potential spread of COVID-19, they should not be running at full capacity. Other characteristics that should be considered are also the qualifications and recommendations of the staff. Other parents' opinions on a child care setting can be very helpful. Some qualifications you can look for are if the child care setting is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) or if you choose at-home childcare, the National Association for Family Child Care.
