to identify all the types of clouds. We even made a cloud in a jar!!



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Middle School News

Sixth Grade News

In sixth grade Science, the students have finished chapter 9 which dealt with classification; the students had a test on that chapter the Wednesday before leaving for Thanksgiving vacation. Upon their return the students began chapter 14, which deals with animals and their behavior.

In Vocabulary, the students have finished unit six and had a quiz on that unit last week, they will begin the unit review which encompasses units 4,5,and 6. With Christmas fast approaching, the sixth grade

Math class is hard at work finishing a section on Median and Mode.

The sixth grade Religion class is currently studying the composition of the Liturgical year beginning with (you guessed it!) Advent.

In grade 6 Social Studies, we have been learning about the exciting history, culture, geography and religions of Ancient India. Our unit will end with an exam, followed by some Indian cuisine.

In grade 6 Literature, we have been reading "The Runaway King". Students have been making predictions, solving problems, and are eager to find out just how King Jaron will avoid a war with Avenia.

Seventh Grade News

In seventh grade Science, the students just began a new chapter dealing with climate and weather, their first quiz in this chapter was the week they returned from vacation.

In Vocabulary the students have finished unit 6 and will have the unit review test on sections 4,5,and 6 sometime this week. As previously mentioned you can follow your students progress in

Vocabulary by signing into their Sadlier account.

The seventh grade Math class is moving on to a study of two step equations.

In the seventh grade Religion class, students are beginning a chapter focusing on the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, Jesus Christ.

In grade 7 Social Studies, we have been looking at how each of the 13 colonies were founded and settled. We have discussed the push and pull factors of immigration, and have looked at how the royal colonies, charter colonies, and proprietary colonies differed.

In grade 7 Literature, we have started reading Charles Dicken's classic, "A Christmas Carol."

Eighth Grade News

In eighth grade Science the students have finished chapter 19 which dealt with the formation of the solar system. Prior to leaving for Thanksgiving vacation the students researched various planets and presented their findings in a power point to their classmates. Upon returning from vacation we

began a new chapter dealing with the universe.

In Vocabulary, the students recently took a quiz on unit 6 and will have the unit review test on sections 4,5,and 6 this week. As previously mentioned you can follow your students progress in Vocabulary by signing into their Sadlier account.

The eighth grade Math class has completed a section on equations and is beginning a section on the simplifying of algebraic expressions by combining like terms.

The eighth grade Religion class has started a chapter on the fourth, fifth, and sixth commandments which are the foundation of our honoring life and creation as followers of Jesus Christ.

In grade 8 Social Studies, we have finished our unit on Whaling, and are now studying the women's movements and the abolitionist movements in the antebellum United States. Students have been showing mature deference as we discuss issues such as racism, sexism, and intersectionality within the contexts of then and now.

In grade 8 Literature, we are nearing the end of Louisa

May Alcott's "Little Women." Students have grown to know Meg, Jo, Beth, Amy, and Laurie, and are eager to read what choices these five very different people will make as the story concludes. On December 12, we will be celebrating the end of the novel with an all-day "Little Women binge-watch", in which the class will view the full PBS mini-series based on the book, as well as the 1994 film. Students are invited to dress-down that day, and we will be having Christmas cookies as well. The assignment following this day will be asking students to critically compare and contrast the series, the film, and the novel.
