David Standley stated that the Moab Waste Water Treatment Plant would be capable to taking care of about 300 additional connections if the current inflow problem was corrected. He said that the availability for federal funds for improvement of the plant is essentially nothing and could not see any change in this situation for several years. Don Ostler stated there is no possibility of the State of Utah having any funds available for the next four or five years for expansion of the plant. Gilger stated that the City of Moab and the District have been working together and have funds available for improving the plant to take care of the additional 300 customers.

Mr. Standley recommended that the 201 study be completed to serve as a guide for expanding the plant. Frank Rueckert said it would take about four to six weeks to complete the study.


201 STUDY
