





Students can bring yarn to the art room before or after school or during YOUR art class.

5th grade Art students created clay pinch pots and added a handle, that turned their creation into ceramic mugs. Students are seen here adding color to the mugs using a variety of glazes. Glazing takes patience and vision, since the colors aren't exactly what will be seen after firing the mugs in the kiln.



To go along with the mug, students created their own weaving loom to make a mug rug (coaster). Yarn donations give students many colors to choose from in their weaving. These two projects, the Clay Mug and Mug Rug, really allowed the 5th grade Art students an opportunity to explore ceramics and fiber arts. Together the projects make a wonderful finished display. If you have any yarn at home, Art is always happy to have more yarn donations.

What Happens on "PLC" Early Release Days?

Before beginning a unit on Informational text reading standards, the **English Language Arts PLCs** created and administered a pre-test using **School City**. The results of said pre-test enabled each teacher to create a series of lessons and forge a path towards proficiency designed solely for their student population.

In the ensuing months, the team perused, compared, and analyzed the data from their common formative assessments (CFAs) as well as the district benchmark test. They looked for data trends, strengths, weaknesses, assessment validity, and employed their findings in planning for how they primarily use their instructional time. The team has spent a fair amount of time pinpointing strategies for tier II and tier III students whose needs are often nuanced and specific.




Additionally, the teachers who've produced successful assessment results have shared their learning plans and strategies with the group so all can implement a successful approach. Just as their reading data has centered around informational text standards, so will their writing data.

Recently, the ELA team compiled several options for the informative essay prompt which included all necessary materials for teachers and students.

By compiling essay options, each teacher is able to select the prompt & documents which are most aligned with their students' needs and interests. Again, time has been dedicated to developing a toolbox of strategies for teaching informational essay writing to tier II and tier III students and to support their specific learning needs throughout the writing process. Once students have completed their essays and each teacher has scored their own, the team will spend a day sharing and grading each other's essays. This will allow them to reflect upon their own grading practices, share fruitful teaching strategies, and reflect on these discussions as they begin planning for their argumentative essay unit in the spring.



CUTS Program: (Court Unified Truancy Suppression)

To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students.
