The deadline for the Department of Arizona WILMA HOYAL-MAXINE CHILTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP is quickly approaching. One annual scholarship of \$1000.00 is available to a student at Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University and the University of Arizona enrolled as a second year or upper division student in Political Science, Public Programs or Special Education.

Any applicant must be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Arizona for at least one year. Honorably discharged veterans or immediate family members of a veteran will be given preference.

Applications must be sent to the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Arizona Headquarters office by May 15.

Recipients will receive awards through the appropriate school offices for each academic year in the following manner: One half of the award will be made available to the recipient at the beginning of fall and spring semesters, dependent on proper enrollment with the university. Applicant must complete at least 12 hours with a grade average of "B" or better, and be enrolled as a fulltime student.

Applications and complete instructions to apply for this scholarship were included in the Education packet distributed at Fall Conference.

Former recipients continuing degree programs as listed above may re-apply provided the applicant complies with rules and submits a new application.

The Registered Dietician, Kelly Hamlin, MA, RDN is coordinating the effort to provide a cooking class for Veterans who would benefit from these skills. Many Veterans at the Yuma CBOC suffer from diabetes, obesity, high blood pressure and kidney issues due to a diet of processed foods. The new Residential Mental Health Rehabilitation facility is now open. This added 25 new beds to house Veterans in various treatment programs with on-site housing on the hospital campus. The staff requesting donations has put forward that donations in kind, rather than monetary donations, would best fill this need. We ordered 150 backpacks and water bottles and provided colored pencils in June, 2018. The Building 95 donation was made possible largely by a very generous donation from Unit 66.

The grand total of monetary donations by American Legion Auxiliary Units for May 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 is \$4,255.00.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 is \$51,059.05. We would like to express special thanks to Elaine Yates and Yuma Unit 19, Unit 7's Ann Reatherford, Unit 24, Unit 131, Unit 132, Unit 73 and Unit 109 members and unaffiliated volunteers for their constant support of VA programs through their donations. The Legion family is the largest supporter of the Arizona Fisher House. Currently, Arizona Fisher House is funded for the foreseeable future. Other programs are in dire need of donations (ie. Homeless, Building 95, Social Services, Bingo, etc.).

Sixteen registered hospital volunteers and nine summer youth volunteers, donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 is 6,109. Occasional hours are 381 donated by one hundred volunteers. The meeting was called to order at 10:07 a.m. by Chairman Dylan Dalzotto and the opening ceremony was conducted.

Bob Dalpe gave a report on "Fort Veteran" for Steve Cooper, Army veteran and Founder of Fort Veteran. This organization is dedicated to helping male veterans educate themselves on men's health issues, entrepreneurs developing their businesses had helping veterans get connected with organization helping veterans. A briefing was given by Carol Golden on how ITS/Intensive Treatment Systems helps Veterans who suffer with alcohol and/or drug addiction. ITS/Intensive Systems is a Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Provider who has been in the Valley for almost 30 years. Treatment is offered to anyone who suffers with Alcohol and/or Drug Addiction. Along with MAT, thee is outpatient counseling; intensive outpatient treatment; individual, family and group counseling; peer support which includes assistance with housing, employment, resources and 1 on 1 support, and most importantly, transportation. ITS is registered with all 7 AHCCCS health plans and the preferred provider for TriWest; it also has funding available for people who have no insurance or who are underinsured. Dr. Barry Goodfield, The Goodfield Institute gave a briefing on "When Life's Just too Much & Operation New Outlook. He has been a psychotherapist for 46 years. The program focuses on suicide prevention. Regardless of who we are most everybody at a certain moment has a time when you say to yourself: Life is just too much! Most of us find friends to review the situation and look for alternatives when something needs to be changed. It can be something with our mind, body, or relationships. Operation New Outlook is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization devoted to veterans with Post Traumatic Stress. For more information you can contact them at email: goodfieldinstitute@mac.com.

Roll call was taken and a quorum was established. Carol Culbertson motioned to accept the minutes as written, second and approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Ray Boucher.

Sickness and Distress – Bernie Kaplan, Army veteran; Past Commander, Jewish War Veterans; AVHOF 2008; fell and was hospitalized last month. Bernie is having multiple health issues. Director Nelson from the VA Medical Facilities gave a report on the VA Hospital. The VA Growth has increased 10% from last year. Women's growth since last year is 16%. Outpatient treatment since last year has increased 11%. The Phoenix VA is now the largest VA in the country. Ms Nelson thanked everyone who was in attendance at the groundbreaking for the new medical clinic being built at 32nd Street and Van Buren. Three requests have been submitted to increase the size of the Southeast and

Northwest facilities. The new Resource Center has serviced over 3,000 veterans since its' opening in September.

Jennifer Harris from ADVS reported on the Vietnam Veterans Ceremony held last week at Wesley Bolin Plaza. She also reported that the Marana Cemetery recently had an inspection. They received 90 out of 100 on the inspection.

A legislative update was given. The bill requesting the identifying branch of service on veterans plates passed. The bill on adding an addition 12 Service Officers has been put on hold. There is a need to have funds allocated before the bill can go any further.

Terry Araman, Legislative liaison has requested that the UAV send a letter in support of SB2093 (VSO's), explaining the importance of this bill to the Governor.

SB1157, to completely eliminate the tax deduction on military retirement is dead.

HB2488 dealing with an annual report from all agencies on Suicides was amended and will go to the house for a final vote.

Carol Culbertson announced that they have received 49 nomination packets for the Hall of Fame Induction.
