The Hole in the Courthouse Ceiling

In the lobby ceiling of the Eastland County Courthouse is a hole. It is high and small enough that unless a person were to look up, it would remain unnoticed. Once seen, it could easily be passed off as normal wear and tear of a historic building. However, it is actually a bullet hole and the last remaining sign of a domestic fatality that occurred within the Courthouse.

While details of that event are now mostly available through word of mouth from those who were there, this hole has not lost its significance because, although that tragedy unfolded nearly four decades ago, the physical and emotional impact of domestic violence is still something that impacts individual and community life in Eastland County today.

It can be easy to shrug off the statistics showing one in five women or one in ten men are impacted by domestic violence as a problem for bigger cities. However, what is not so easy to put aside are the local numbers from an agency providing services to those who choose to seek out help.

Last year, the Eastland County Crisis Center provided over 4,000 domestic violence services to men, women, and child victims of abuse. These victims came from all communities and crossed all traditional demographic lines. They sit in church pews, football bleachers, restaurant booths, or in the car behind you at the light. They bring you food, stand behind you in line at the bank, or maybe even wave at you from across the street. They are as much a part of this community as any other person. And yet, far too many suffer in silence- afraid of the embarrassment, shame, or even risk of future harm if they were to leave.

This month, all citizens of Eastland County are asked to join the Eastland County Crisis Center in a wide range of Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM) activities to show support for those victims who have come forward or those who may be afraid to do so, that they are not forgotten. They are not to blame for the abuse. They can have hope.

The hole in the Courthouse ceiling may one day entirely disappear, but for now it serves as a reminder of how serious domestic violence can be.
