Here are some things people have said:

+ I vote in the Assembly Member's (or Senator's) district.

+ I want the Assemblyman (or Senator) to oppose Assemblyman Mosley's Bill A10731, which wrongly blames the SHSAT for low Black and Latino enrollments in the Specialized High Schools.

+ The Bill is a transparent, unfair plan to slash Asian enrollment in the Specialized High Schools.

+ My child spent a lot of time studying hard to do well in school, so that he (or she) can go to a Specialized High School. It is not fair to diminish his (her) chances just because of the color of his (or her) skin.

+ To benefit everyone's education, we should build 10 more specialized high schools, and put G&T programs in every school district.

+ Blacks and Hispanics used to be more than half of Brooklyn Tech. That's when they had G&T programs in their neighborhoods. Now they don't have any. Bring back G&T programs to every neighborhood!

+ The Bill lets New York City destroy some of the best schools in the system. The State should instead order the City to add more good schools, and make other schools better.

+ Don't blame the SHSAT when two thirds of Blacks and Hispanic are behind grade level by middle school. That's the real problem, and despite the City spending hundreds of millions, things have only gotten worse. That's why families of all races are fleeing the school system. This Bill is just superficial cosmetics.
