Faith in Motion: Mt. Calvary Youth Attends 64th Progressive National Baptist Convention 2025

This summer, July 20-24, to be exact, I had the distinct honor of accompanying four of our youth from Mt. Calvary Baptist Church to the Progressive National Baptist Convention (PNBC) in Chicago, Illinois. What began as a road trip quickly transformed into a spiritual journey, one marked by fellowship, learning, and growth in Christ. From the early morning departure on that Sunday to the final reflections on our return. This journey was a testament to God's faithfulness and the promise of our next generation.

The Road to Revelation

We met at Mt. Calvary at 4:40 AM on July 20th, full of anticipation and excitement. After a short drive to meet our charter bus, we embarked on the long journey to Chicago. Stops in Nashville, Tennessee, and Indianapolis, Indiana, offered moments of rest and reflection, but also opportunities for our youth to engage with new environments and people. The bus itself became a sanctuary filled with gospel music, faith-based films, joyful conversation, and the opportunity to get plenty of sleep. It was clear that God was present, even in transit.

A Feast of the Word

PNBC delivered powerful preaching and teaching for all ages. Our youth were engaged in messages and activities that challenged and inspired them:

James 2:17 – Faith without works is dead. They learned that belief must be matched with action.

Psalm 133:1 – "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" They experienced this firsthand.

1 Timothy 4:12 – "Let no one despise your youth..." They were reminded that leadership begins now, not later.

These scriptures came alive through workshops, worship, fun activities, and real-life examples of service and justice. Our youth left with a deeper understanding of how to live out their faith boldly and sincerely.

Fellowship Across Generations

One of the most powerful aspects of the convention was the fellowship. Our youth connected with peers from across the country, discovering that their walk with Christ is part of a much larger movement. They prayed, worshiped, and shared stories—building bonds that transcended geography.

A New Lens on Ministry

For all four youth, this was their first PNBC experience, and the exposure was life-changing. Worshipping with hundreds of believers revealed the power of collective praise. They engaged with mentors who encouraged them toward ministry, education, and community involvement. Though our time in Chicago was limited, the city itself and the PNBC offered a glimpse into how faith intersects with urban life. The youth saw firsthand how churches are addressing social justice, education, and transitioning beyond Sunday services. It was a living example of faith in action.

Seeds of the Future

This trip was a blessing from beginning to end. The journey strengthened bonds within our church family, deepened the youth's spiritual walk, and broadened their vision of God's Kingdom. They represented Mt. Calvary with excellence, and we can be proud of the seeds planted during this convention. Seeds that we pray will bear fruit for years to come.

I am grateful to God for allowing me to witness this moment in our youth journey. The trip to the 64th Progressive National Baptist Convention was more than a trip; it was a divine appointment.

After an exhausting eleven-hour bus ride from Atlanta (those cupholders were particularly unforgiving!), I arrived in Chicago exhilarated for our 63rd Annual PNBC Session themed "It's Time." Upon waking and exploring the city on foot, I quickly discovered the beauty of Chicago-taking in the gorgeous aquamarine river running right through downtown and soon after booking it over to the magnificent outdoorsy backdrop that is Millennium Park, which features contemporary art like The Bean and Crown Fountain, where children played in bliss running barefoot on slick concrete and lying flat out under the sprays of waterfalls. At night, I attended the sermons that left me spiritually energized—my absolute favorite part of our Annual Sessions. The "Taste of Chicago Choirs" was first: four powerhouse choirs who each sang medleys of all my favorite gospel songs, which then flowed into Rev. Dr. Charlie Dates' timely message about mending the relationship between truth and legality in our current sociopolitical landscape using Nehemiah's contrarian example—leaving me feeling empowered and strong. The following night, President's Night featured a blowout concert-styled performance by the prolific Chicago Mass Choir, followed by our President, Rev. Dr. David Peoples, who delivered a stirring message on God's omnipotent power—citing Him as the pull on the planets and the roaring in the rivers, reminding us that through Him we have "power, love, and a sound mind" to rise up and use our faith to propel us forward. Though my time ended too soon, this blend of spiritual renewal and urban discovery perfectly embodied our theme. I'm already excited for the 64th Annual Session in Washington DC, July 20-23 2026 —until then, may we carry that divine power into every corner of our daily lives.
