## AFTER COURSE COMPLETION & NEW EMT TIPS

### EXAMINATION: TEST VOUCHERS MAY BE AVAILABLE FOR RURAL AGENCIES!!

- See National Registry (NR) Exam instructions at <a href="www.nremt.org">www.nremt.org</a> or <a href="How to Apply for a Certification">How to Apply for a Certification</a> <a href="Examination">Examination</a> | National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians</a> on how to apply for the NREMT exam. <a href="Start applying 3-4">Start applying 3-4</a> weeks in advance of when you plan to test. Felony convictions may prevent or delay processing/certification. Use correct Training Program. See instructions. <a href="Authorizations to Test">Authorizations to Test (ATT)</a> for National EMS Certification will be valid for up to 90 days.

- For Washington State Certification, applicants must have a current NREMT certification.
  - All certification exam results (written and psychomotor) are valid for 24 months from the date
    of the examination.
  - Unsuccessful attempts will require retesting, additional testing fees, and under certain circumstance require refresher training. Approved refresher training covering specific topics and pass the department-approved certification examinations.
  - Exam results are usually received within three business days after testing. Test results will expire after 24 months.
  - If not state certified within 24 months of course completion or NREMT certification is lapsed, you may be required to complete the EMT Re-entry Pathway <u>Regain EMT Certification: National</u> Registry Re-entry Requirements | National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians
  - o If certification is delayed, the MPD may require additional training and assessments.
  - O DON'T WAIT TO TEST!!
- Passing the National Registry exam and receiving a National Registry EMT card <u>DOES NOT</u> mean you are certified in Washington State. <u>Apply Login SecureAccess Washington.</u>

## CERTIFICATIONS: PLEASE COMPLETE WA STATE APPLICATION WITHIN 30-DAYS!

- NREMT Certification is good for approximately two years. Renewal is not required for WA state. Know NREMT renewal requirements. National Registry EMT Recertification: Requirements and Pathways | National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians
- Certification in Washington State requires the following:
  - o Successful completion of a state approved course
  - o Pass the National Registry Exam within two years of course completion.
  - o Complete current State Application (EMS agency and MPD recommendation)
- WA State application packet for Initial Certification (processing may take up to 2-4 weeks),
  - o Online <u>Login SecureAccess Washington</u> (RECOMMENDED)
  - Hard copy go to Initial EMS Certification Application Packet (wa.gov)

#### Requirements: online or hard copy

- Agency affiliation (Supervisor signature and date)
- o Clear copy of ID (i.e., drivers). Photo must be clear, and information must be legible.
- o Copy of Course Completion Certificate (if EMT includes SGA training)
- Copy of current NREMT certification (certification #)
- Medical Program Director Recommendation (Kittitas County specific requirements)
  - Hard copy submit to County EMS Office for MPD signature.
  - Acknowledgement of Protocols & Procedures (available online only) go to:
     http://www.kittitascountyems.org/, click on "Certification" and follow instructions to
     complete the review for your certification level and submit the on-line form.

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- How to check the status of your state application online once it is processed:
  - o Go to: https://fortress.wa.gov/doh/providercredentialsearch/ OR Login SecureAccess Washington
  - o Select "Health Care Provider", then your credential type (i.e., Emergency Medical Technician)
  - o Search by last and first name (or first letter of first name in case misspelled)
  - o Allow 2 weeks to show "pending" when no extenuating circumstances..
  - Once your status reflects "active", you are considered certified in WA State. Make sure you
     DOWNLOAD your WA State EMT card <u>Login SecureAccess Washington</u>
- If you plan to be affiliated with more than one agency, you must submit a "Personal Status Change" application for each additional agency in the applicable county. Submit an online application after initial certification has been issued. Gt to: <u>Login SecureAccess Washington</u>
- All communications from WA DOH Credentialing and KCEMS Office are by email.

# ONGOING TRAINING & EVALUATION PROGRAM (OTEP) / CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION (CME) - OTEP method is recommended and does not require NREMT exam.

- Ongoing Training & Evaluation Program / Continuing Medical Education participation recommended as soon as you complete your initial training course and/or obtain state certification. Go to link for state regulations and codes. <u>Chapter 246-976 WAC:</u> Also, see Medical Program Director Operational Policies in your primary county or contact EMS Office.
- To stay current with OTEP in Kittitas County, you must complete the OTEP modules in the year
  they are offered from the time of your certification. At a minimum, participation is required
  quarterly. Exceptions are made for extenuating circumstances only with MPD approval. OTEP
  modules or CME completed prior to certification, does not count towards recertification
  requirements, but may keep you eligible for certification. Requirements may vary by county.
   See OTEP guidelines for primary county.
- Kittitas County Ongoing Training & Evaluation Program instructions and schedule can be
  obtained at the Kittitas County EMS Division website <a href="www.kittitascountyems.org">www.kittitascountyems.org</a>, go to Training
  page. To receive a monthly training announcement and training materials via email, please send
  your email address and request to <a href="kcems@co.kittitas.wa.us">kcems@co.kittitas.wa.us</a>. Certification applicants will
  automatically be added, but we don't mind the reminder.
- OTEP & CME training records you obtain for recertification are your property right as is your certification in Washington State. All continuing medical education records (CME/OTEP) should be kept a minimum of seven years. <u>YOU</u> are responsible for these records, not your agency, not the instructors, and not the County EMS Office. <u>DO NOT</u> rely on anyone to maintain these records for you! You may request a copy of your ongoing training records at any time.

If you have questions or concerns, contact the EMS Office in the county where you plan to have your primary affiliation or receive training.
