War Office Plan for the dispersal of 2 Polcorps upon their arrival in Britain from Italy

They were to be distributed across the various Commands in Britain... the exception being Scotland. Most of 1st Corps were based there and it was felt that a further influx of Poles would antagonize the local population. Even so, 4,640 were sent there regardless.

Where the Poles ended up and eventually settled largely depended on luck and to which unit they belonged. Initially they were housed in vacated barracks (often US or Canadian) before being demobilized into the Polish Resettlement Corps.

There was only marginal migration from these first settlement areas and most of that happened when sufficient accommodation and work became available. Certainly, the big cities drew many and they became visible communities, but there remained a huge, widely dispersed Polish community in rural Britain.
