This is one of my most favorite times of the year! Celebrations with family, friends and neighbors abound. This month I thought I'd share an excerpt of a success story from the National Auxiliary website:

Nichole, a mother of eight and avid motorcycle rider, has been a member of the American Legion Auxiliary for four years. "We've made awesome friends," Nichole shared. "I just can't even explain how I feel about people in the post because they're like family. I love them."

Like so many, Nichole's husband was the victim of a poor economy and was laid off from his job. After a while, their bills began to build up, and with eight children to feed, it came to a point where they needed to ask for help. After talking with her unit president, Nichole was encouraged to apply to the Auxiliary Emergency Fund for assistance. She was awarded a Temporary Financial Assistance grant, which they were able to put toward their increasing bills.

"It meant a lot," she said. "It makes me feel like the whole organization cares about its members and its communities. It made me feel better knowing the kids were going to have electricity and water. My husband was surprised. He was kind of lost for words at first. He thought we were going to be stuck in that hole for a bit."

The AEF is possible only through members' commitment to helping one another. If members and supporters of the ALA weren't willing to donate their time and money to the AEF, it wouldn't be here to help members like Nichole and her family when they need it. Luckily, members helping members is a long-standing ideal of the ALA, and as long as it is, no Auxiliary member will have to face their crisis alone.

"I wouldn't even know how much to thank them," Nichole said. "I give them so much credit for donating the money and wanting to help and wanting to be there to do that. Those people have big hearts."

Perhaps you can start a new tradition by donating to the AEF at this time of year in honor of veterans and their families everywhere.

Happy Thanksgiving Arizona ALA! Fall Conference covered many topics and there was a question raised to this committee about Solicitation. Please refer to the Department Policies and Procedures Manual pages 21-22 which states as follows:

"NO SOLICITATION SHALL BE MADE BY ANY OFFICER, CHAIRMAN, OR MEMBER OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY, payable to the Department or person making request, without written permission of the Department President and the Department Finance Committee. Anyone asking a solicitation must state in the written request that permission has been granted by the Department President and the Department Finance Committee."

What does this mean? Can you post on social media? Can you list any price? The key word here is solicitation:

Solicitation is defined as a request or appeal, either oral or written, or any endeavor to obtain, seek or plead for funds, property, financial assistance or other thing of value, including any money or property of value.

Social media is a great place to advertise, however; "Ring Your Bell" is not the place to post any event with a price. It is best to use your Unit/Post website to share that information. If your Unit has the desire to raise funds for your programs, stay within your Unit. You can list prices for an event at your Post or Unit Website. Please any questions or comments, please feel free to ask.

American Legion Auxiliary Arizona Girls State packets for the 2023 session have been signed for at Fall Conference or mailed to the Unit. Please familiarize yourself with the information or read over it again.

It is most important that you contact the schools you were assigned and get the needed information. School assignment is on the back of the purple sheet to the Unit President or Chairman. Completed school information will be what you put on the green sheet and return to Department before or by the December 15<sup>th</sup> deadline.

Why is this information so important?

It saves the cost of mailing a major packet of information on the ALA Arizona Girls State program, the packet is emailed to the person that is in charge of this activity at the school. We have found that emailing is an effective way of getting the information need to the schools in a timely manner, having a record of when and to whom the information was sent and provides personal contact. We know that sometimes counselors change after you give us the information and we try and keep up with new information.

We are so glad to be back in schools again. If you have a problem with a school, please give me that information as we have a waiting list to get into the program. Please remember you are representing the American Legion Auxiliary when working with schools.

In January, the information is emailed to the school contact you have provided us and the hard registration card, that needs to be notarized, is snail mailed to that person at the school. These cards are given to the delegates and alternates after selections are made, again saving the cost of postage.

Next month's bulletin will have sample interview questions that you might want to use, and we encourage you to interview whenever possible. We know some Units have your own form of interviewing and that is okay too. If you are unable to interview, please make sure that schools know what is required to attend. All the facts are in the brochure and your packet.

Are you using you check list to stay on track? We sure hope so. We are most grateful for the help and support you give the Girls State program! If you have any questions or need information, please contact us so we can get you the answer. Please know that you **DO** make a difference in the life of those that attend Girls State.

#### VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER December 2022

All events are suspended until further notice. There is communication that some volunteer activities will be restarting. No specifics as of this date. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Ward W2 (Dementia Ward) in Building 60 is currently seeking twin size blankets for their patients. They request that the blankets be different colors/patterns so each patient will recognize their personal blanket. They are also requesting clothing donations (sweatshirts and sweatpants all sizes especially size small in "girly" colors for the two female Veterans, socks and shoes men's sizes 9 and above). Many of the Veterans they serve come in with no clothing.

Southwestern Blind Rehabilitation Center (SWBRC) is continuing going on outings where they are invited. They would like to request support for outings which are not direct donations such as going to the movies, Pima Air & Space museum, Botanical Garden, etc. These outings must be financed by donations of either gift cards or the purchase of tickets directly by the sponsor. They currently have a population of twenty.

Patriot Pantry is up and running at is currently supporting 40 to 50 Veterans with food insecurities. The current monthly cost for this program is estimated at \$1,000. Since VA funds cannot be used to purchase the food, different donors are shopping and delivering the items to SAVAHCS. Our new Deputy Representative Dawn Davidson and I had a wonderful time shopping for and delivering the donation from the American Legion Auxiliary. Thank you to Units 131 and 132 for their generous contributions to this program.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to October 31, 2022 is \$7,095.00. Thank you to Units 66 & 131 for their generous donations. Through their help, we were able to support the Wheelchair Games, the Community Gardens program and the Gathering of American Indian Veterans program.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to October 31, 2022 is \$5,448.27. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 39, Unit 66, Unit 109, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Eight registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2022 to October 31, 2022 is 442.5. We have on-boarded two new volunteers whose hours will benefit the American Legion Auxiliary.

This chairman has volunteered 96 hours and logged 1,020 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of October 31, 2022. This chairman has now logged over 4,000 hours in service to SAVAHCS. This chairman was re-elected to be the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the VAVS Executive Committee at the meeting on October 12, 2021. This chairman has been elected to fill a three year term on the VAVS Executive Committee. This chairman has attended every Executive Committee meeting and every VAVS meeting this year. This chairman worked with all Units to provide beverages and snacks for staff, patients and volunteers who were manning the COVID-19 vaccination sites. This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need during this time of enormous stress on all community resources. This chairman is actively supporting the Patriot Pantry at SAVAHCS. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. National Veterans Creative Arts Festival was held September 14 & 15, 2022 and this chairman participated both days. Annual Joint Review was completed November 8, 2022.
